EGGS HIGHER IN PORTLAND MART

Receipts Fall Down—Cold Weather Stimulates the Demand

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 25 (AP)—Local fresh egg prices are higher again today in the face of lower levels in the south. On the day's exchange extras, firsts and current receipts are posted a cent higher at 32 cents, 32 and 30 cents, respectively.

Receipts are not so liberal and the demand has been stimulated by colder weather. Monday's arrivals amounted to 725 cases and there was no movement out of storage to speak of.

The butter market is also responding to weather conditions. Cattle prices are firm with prime firsts up a half cent at 45 cents. Other grades remained unchanged. Demand for calves continues healthy, especially on high score stock.

Receipts of surplus stock from the country yesterday dropped to 2087 pounds. The bulk of local creameries also fell off with only 12,744 pounds reported.

Prices are fully maintained in country dressed meats and while the Tuesday arrivals were somewhat heavier there was a brisk outlet for all fancy stuff. Calves are holding at 15 cents and hogs at 17 cents.

Bears Continue To Hold Upper Hand in Street

NEW YORK, Jan. 25 (AP)—Opposing speculative forces continued to struggle for control of the price movements in today's stock market, but the line of least resistance was again downward. Certain rail equipment and automotive issues were bid up at intervals in an apparent attempt to rally the general list, but the pressure against other stocks was too great.

Among the stocks which were prominent in the sporadic rallies that took place throughout the session were Bangor and Aroostook, Columbia Carbon, Hudson Motor, Mack Trucks, Philadelphia and Reading Coal and Iron, Pressed Steel Car, Radio Corporation and Timken Roller Bearing.

Pere Marquette sold two points below last night's final quotation, as did Reading, New York Central, Great Northern preferred and several others.

The closing was weak. The low prices of the day were made in the final hour of trading when extensive offerings of dividend paying rails were thrown on the market. Chesapeake and Ohio was off 6 points and Pittsburgh and West Virginia, Pere Marquette, New York Central and Atlantic Coast Line were down about two points. Total sales approximated 2,000,000 shares.

Dentist to Face Murder Charge; Complaint Filed

SEATTLE, Jan. 25 (AP)—Formal charges of first degree murder were filed in justice court here today against Dr. C. C. Dobbs, Kirkland dentist who has been held in the county jail since Saturday for investigation in connection with the slaying of Letitia Whitcomb, 14-year-old dental patient.

Discovery of a poisonous drug, sometimes used by dentists, in the body of the girl, together with the statement of two youths that they saw a man resembling Dobbs leaning over a bridge over the swamp where the body was found, was said today by Prosecutor Ewing B. Colvin to be the basis for the charge.

Maintains Innocence
Dobbs has firmly and calmly maintained his innocence as well as his willingness to give any information in his possession to aid in a solution of the murder mystery. Sheriff's deputies and private detectives had made three separate searches of Dobbs' home and office for traces of the poisonous drug found in the body, but have admitted nothing even resembling it has been discovered, although William Dehn, University of Washington chemist, who isolated the poisonous substance in the stomach of the girl, is analyzing liquids and salts found in Dobbs' dental office.

The girl's body, which bore signs of a struggle, was found in a trough across Lake Washington, from Seattle, Nov. 4. Numerous arrests followed discovery of the body, but the suspects were released when no evidence could be found to fasten the crime on them.

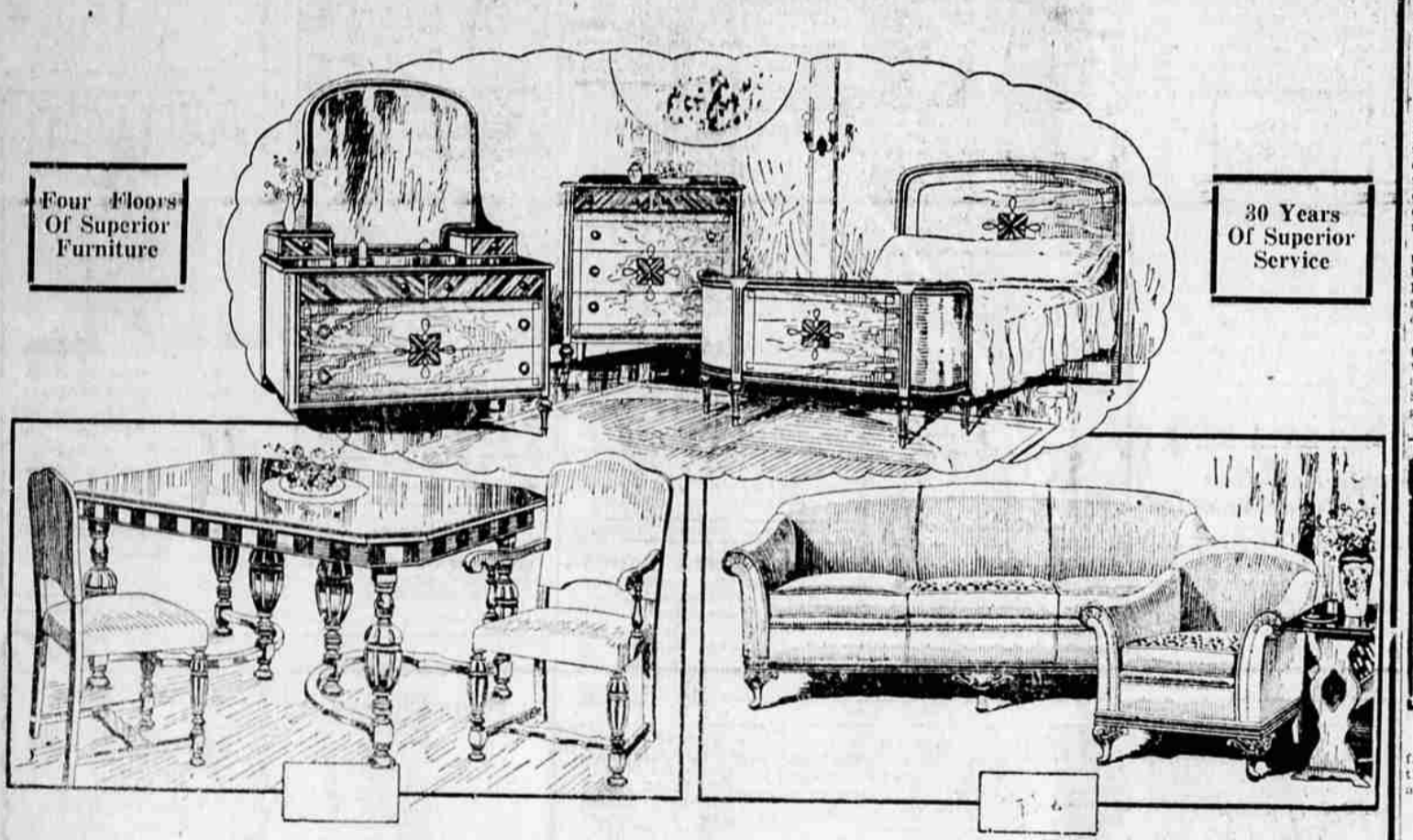

CHICAGO, Jan. 25 (By the Associated Press)—Starting at 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 upturn, Chicago wheat held near to the initial range. Corn, oats and provisions were steady, corn opening at 1/2 off to 1/2 gain and later showing little variation. Wheat closed strong, 1 1/2 to 1 3/4; not higher; corn 1/2 to 1/4 up; oats at 1/4 to 1/2 advance, and provisions unchanged to a rise of 1/8c.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 25 (AP)—A demand by the Oregon legislature for a congressional investigation of the Herick Lumber company's concession in the Malheur national forest urged in a resolution introduced yesterday by Senator Cameron, republican, of Arizona, was read today in the senate.

A long telegraphic protest was presented by Senator Cameron in behalf of Senator Stanfield, republican, Oregon, who also sponsored the resolution presented by Cameron yesterday.

On motion of Senator Norris, republican, Nebraska, the memorial was referred to the committee on agriculture and forestry, of which Senator McNary, republican, Oregon, is chairman.
