ARGUMENTS OVER 'RED' CONTINUE

Ability of Grange on the Gridiron Is Aired in Spirited Debates

By Billy Evans White football is now more or less passe, the argument as to how great a player "Red" Grange really was continues.

It is possible to offer arguments pro and con as to Grange's true worth, but there is no denying that he is the most sensational performer the gridiron has produced in the last 10 years if not more.

There is a decided line of distinction between sensational and great. In a sense, Grange possessed both qualities to a marked degree.

Recently Glenn Warner, famous Stanford coach, in naming his all-time grid team, didn't give Grange much consideration. Said he was mighty good but there were a number of other halfbacks he ranked superior to "Red."

Any time anyone takes the deeds of "Red" Grange to task a half dozen self-appointed supporters come forth in his defense.

In Defense of "Red" "If the Big Ten has produced a better halfback than Grange in the last 10 years I wish someone would name him," writes Illial 1919.

"I have been watching Big Ten football for a score of years, played it myself, and to my way of thinking 'Red' Grange, Upp of Notre Dame excepted, is as good a halfback as the west has seen in years.

"Detractors of Grange insist he was a poor defensive player. Coach Zuppke once answered that question for all time, I thought, by stating that it was ridiculous to insist on defensive play from a man who was a touchdown threat any time he got his hands on the ball.

"Grange could play a good defensive game. Any time as safety man he had to make a tough tackle, he seldom failed."

Had Two Big Years In the same mail came another letter from a supporter of Grange, asking that I reproduce the achievements of "Red" on the gridiron in 1923 and 1924. It was in those two years that Grange thrilled the west in almost every game he played.

Going over my records I find that in 1924 Grange gained 1164 yards and made 13 touchdowns for Illinois. His greatest performance was against Michigan, when he gained the almost unbelievable total of 402 yards. He also went pretty well against Chicago, gaining an even 200 yards.

Had he not been stopped to a whiplash in the Michigan game, when the Illinois line failed to hold for him, Grange gaining only 56 yards, he would have topped his remarkable performance of 1923.

Most Remarkable Average During the 1923 campaign, Grange, in seven games, gained 1260 yards, his best performance. He was consistently good in every game that season. His best work was 251 yards against Northwestern, playing only 19 minutes. His low mark was 140 yards in 30 minutes against Wisconsin.

While Grange gained more yards in 1923 than '24, his average was higher during the '24 season. That year he carried the ball 114 times and gained 1164 yards, a terrific better than 10 yards every time he tucked the ball under his arm.

No matter there have been offers will be better halfbacks than "Red" Grange, but it is a certainty his grid deeds will live as long as the game is played.

BAKER LIKES TO PLAY SO TURNS PROFESSIONAL

"Moon" Baker, Northwestern's great halfback, has come into professional athletics that he may continue playing his favorite sport "with the same class of fellows I played with in college." He made his professional debut with the basketball team of Rockford, Ill., his home town, to replenish the income which is taking him through college. Whether he will play professional football depends on offers he may receive. "I am only 21," Baker says, "and I have served my time in college athletics just when I have reached the peak of my interest in sports. That's my reason for turning pro."

Cobb to Return To Baseball in Coming Season

AUGUSTA, Ga., Jan. 28 (AP)—Ty Cobb definitely announced today he would return to baseball this year.

The former manager of the Detroit Tigers said he was "going back for one more year" after having been vindicated by Commissioner of Baseball Landis of charges brought by "Dutch" Leonard but that he had not decided where he would play.

In what he termed his first "official" statement since reading Landis' decision exonerating him, Cobb said he did not want it said that his last game had been played while he was under a cloud of suspicion and that he felt he was "honor bound" to get back into baseball.

"I fully intended to retire permanently," the Georgian Pelech continued, "but since this thing has come up I have decided I will have to go back and have one more big year."

HORSE RACING GAME PROSPERS IN JAPAN

Horse racing in Japan has not shared the "hard times" at which business men grumbled during the last year. Official figures show racing fans paid 23,935,240 yen into the various pari-mutuels. This sum (about \$1,042,000) is exclusive of admission fees paid to see the races. Twenty yen is the maximum a person is permitted by law to bet on one horse.

ADAMS HOLDS RECORD WITH TWIN RELEASES

Charles ("Habe") Adams, out of the major leagues after years of pitching, holds one record not generally recognized—he was twice unconditionally released by the same club, Pittsburgh. The "Habe" was released in 1916 at the end of ten years service with the Pirates. He went into business, but was back in baseball in the minors the next year and in 1918 returned to Pittsburgh. He drew his second release last season after a flare up resulting from a movement to oust Fred Clarke from the bench.
