YOUR INCOME TAX

No. 13

To the taxpayer whose gross or net income for 1926 was \$5,000 or less, and was derived chiefly from salary or wages, the problem of correctly making out an income tax return is not difficult. Such returns are made on Form 1040A, a single sheet. Persons, any part of whose net income, regardless of amount, was derived from a business or profession, including farming, are required to use the larger form, 1040.

The gross income of the usual business consists of the gross profits on sales, plus any income from investments and incidental or outside operations or sources. The return must show the gross sales, purchases, and cost of goods sold. To reflect net income correctly, inventories are necessary at the beginning and end of each taxable year.

The lawyer, doctor, architect, author, dentist, clergyman, or other professional man must, in gross income, include all fees, salaries, and compensation for professional services. The farmer is required to report as gross income all profits derived from the sale or exchange of farm products and livestock, whether produced on the farm or purchased and resold. The fair market value of merchandise or groceries exchanged for farm products must be included; also, profits from renting a farm on the crop-sharing basis and the rental and sale of farm lands.

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 31 (AP)—Goose lake, big body of water lying partly in Lake county and partly in California, is filling up according to Dan P. Gossill, deputy game warden of Lakeview, who visited the state game commission offices Saturday. That lake and nearly all of the many other lakes in that district, dried up completely last summer which was the first of a series of particularly dry years. The body of the lake is about 12 miles, and its depth at one time was 29 feet. Because of this size it will take two or three seasons like this before the lake will reach its old dimensions, Gossill said.

Farm Pointers

Successful poultrymen of Oregon are taking advantage of the slack period before the incubating season to examine and repair their incubators. Thermometers are tested because they may vary a degree from last year. All mechanical parts are put into good condition before the season starts.

Careful cultivation of narcissus bulbs to destroy the pupae is aiding in exterminating the narcissus bulb fly in Oregon, according to experiment station authorities. Soil examinations for pupae are saving the growers money, as each pupa that is destroyed saves nearly 100 bulbs. Each fly is able to lay 100 eggs and each grub that enters a bulb destroys it. These bulbs are worth from 2 cents to 45 cents, so the loss that one fly produces amount to a considerable sum of money.

Sanitation on Oregon farms has been found by the experiment station to be too often neglected. In-

Total cost of materials is less than \$20; the greatest cost being \$16 for cement. The following materials are needed in construction: Two 4-inch pipe, 15 feet of cement, 1 1/2 cubic yards sand, 2 1/2 cubic yards gravel, reinforcing wire and lumber for forms and lattice boards.

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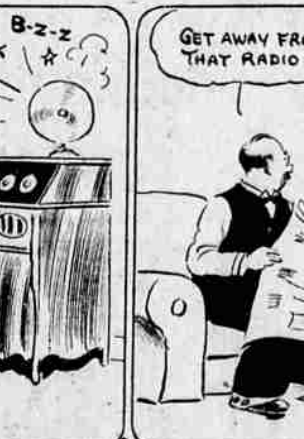
