

ISSUES MOVE UP TO HIGH LEVELS

Outbursts of Strength Features Stock Exchange Trading

NEW YORK, Feb. 8 (By the Associated Press).—With speculative imagination fired by recent merger key roads, the stock market today developed another outburst of strength, sending over a score issues to their highest prices in years.

Rails continued to monopolize interest. Wheeling and Lake Erie common was run up 35 points to 130 on a further retreat of the "short" interests and the preferred soared over 13 points. New peak prices since 1924 or longer, also were registered by St. Paul issue, Chicago Great Western common and preferred, Wabash common,

Reading and Chicago and Eastern Illinois common, the gains running as high as 5 1/2 points.

Remington Typewriter soared 13 points to a record high at 152. Federal Mining and Smelting common jumped seven points, the preferred 5 3/4, and Houston Oil, Pressed Steel Car, National Cloak and Suit preferred and Producers and Refiners sold 2 to 5 points higher.

The closing was irregular. Wheeling and Lake Erie common collapsed to 101 and the preferred to 87. Baldwin crossed 161 and Hudson Motors 65. Pittsburg and West Virginia jumped 7 1/2 points. Reading five and American Republic eight. Total sales approximated 2,400,000 shares.

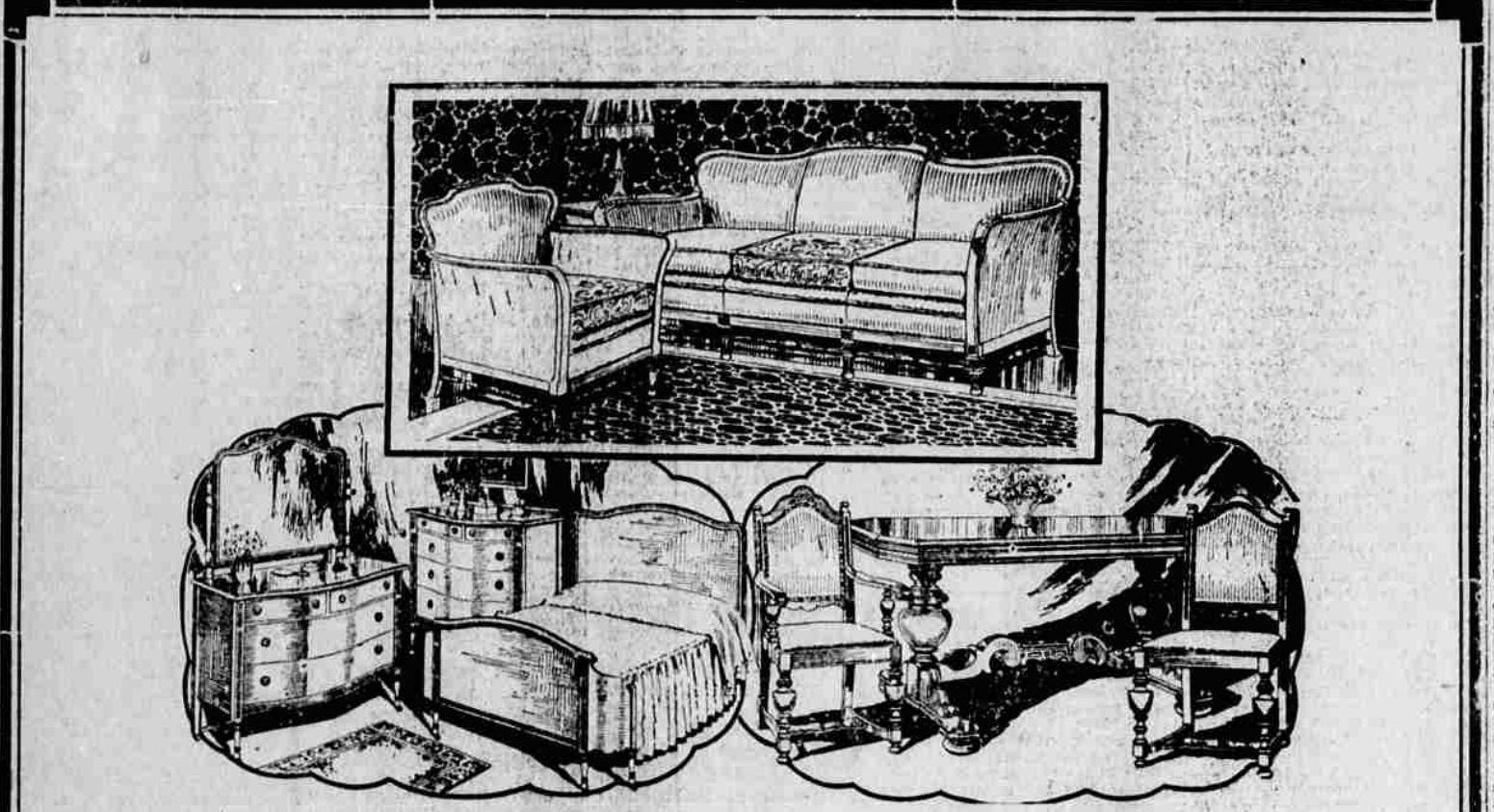
