

PAVED ROAD MAY LINK CONTINENTS

Modern Highway Extending from Canada to S. A. Is Favored

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12 (NEA)—The proposal for a modern highway extending from Canada through the United States, Mexico, Central and South America, and linking 19 countries may be given government support.

Senator Ralph H. Cameron is sponsoring the plan in the senate and congressman C. J. McLeod, Michigan, has introduced a similar bill in the house.

The Central and South American countries included on the suggested route, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia, Venezuela, Brazil, Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia, Chile, Paraguay and Argentina.

In support of the measure Senator Cameron says, "The highway, linking 19 countries, will improve and strengthen all of the coun-

tries, socially, economically and politically.

"Individual, personal contact by tourists and visitors along the route and branch roads will create friendships and open new trade of extraordinary value."

Senator Cameron says that many attempts have been made by private individuals to encourage the building of the highway but without success. He believes that only a government commission can undertake the work.

Hawaiian Sells 31 Autos in December

HONOLULU, Feb. 12 (NEA)—Frank Amana, here, is credited with being Hawaii's crack automobile salesman. Amana set his high sales mark during the month of December when he sold 31 motor cars at a total value of \$32,000.

TRACTOR SALES IN YEAR HEAVY

Bunting Company, with \$300,000-Year, Finds Business Growing

The Bunting Tractor company reports a very satisfactory outlook for the sale of "Caterpillar" tractors and "Holt" combined harvesters during this year. Sales since the first of the year have been unusually heavy for the winter months in this district, it is said.

A shipment of a "Caterpillar" sixty and a "Caterpillar" 2-ton is now enroute for Wallawa and will be unloaded and turned over to the county officials at Enterprise early next week. Three Holt log trailers of ten tons capacity each, were delivered to the Hollo-Layette Lumber company by the company last week. Orders are on the way for five tractors and two six-ton harvesters according to the company's report, and eight farmers have placed their orders for "Holt" combined harvesters for the coming season.

The Bunting Tractor company also reports sales in excess of \$300,000 during 1926. Sales to date this year are far in excess of the same period last year so local officials anticipate a volume for 1927 in excess of \$500,000.00.

Bus Market Active

"The desire to 'ride on rubber' exists as emphatically abroad as it does in the United States. Bus registration in Calcutta has increased from 15 to 450 vehicles in the past year and a half. There are 3,000 miles of bus routes operated by the South African rail-

ways. There are 150 buses in Johannesburg and 50 in Capetown.

Motor Trucks in Demand

"South Africa is likewise finding that trucks give a profitable service per dollar. It now has 6,000 motor trucks in use up to 75,000 passenger cars. As the cars are used in many utilitarian ways the total fleet for this region is \$3,000 vehicles."

"In parts of East Africa the motor truck is solving the problem of the insect fly. This insect has made the use of horses on farms almost impossible. Mechanical transportation is having a strong favorable influence in building up agriculture."

"Advances in the interest in motor travel abroad is evidenced by the fact that in New Zealand there are sixteen motor clubs with 25,000 members. In Burma the sales of cars are 25 per cent ahead of last year. Egypt now has approximately 5,000 private motor cars in addition to 1,000 buses and 4,200 taxis."

Service Problem Acute

"One of the chief current problems, which will be less pressing as motor registration increases, is the need in many communities for more service and gasoline stations. In Nairobi, for example, a 20 gallon gasoline tank is desirable. Models of cars which carry not only rear trunks but likewise have a top trunk rack meet a real need. The car is a family affair and the length of the trips means that adequate baggage facilities are important."

"The same situation applies to tools. A much more complete tool kit is desirable than is necessary in the United States, because the buyer as a rule must do his own repairing."

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Worldwide Growth in the Use of Automobiles Seen by Observer

Bringing reports of record progress in motor travel throughout the world during 1927, Walton Schmidt, field representative of the national automobile chamber of commerce, arrived in New York on the Hemicar today.

Schmidt has just completed an eleven months survey in different parts of the world, particularly Australia, Asia and Africa, meeting with officials of the various countries and conferring with them on motor transportation needs abroad.

In addition to responding to many invitations to tell of America's experience in developing motor travel, Mr. Schmidt particularly devoted himself to getting a better appreciation of motor problems and growth.

New Era Beginning

"It seems clear that the world is at the start of a very large increase in its transportation facilities," said Mr. Schmidt in summing up his observations. "In each country that I visited the government officials, the trade and the general public, were alive to the possibilities of the present day. At Melbourne, for instance attendance at the automobile show was 102,122, an amazing total considering the limited population."

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
