YOUR INCOME TAX

No. 26
Amounts paid accrued within the taxable year 1926 as interest on indebtedness are deductible, with certain exceptions, from gross income in determining net income. Such items include interest on money borrowed to defray personal expenses and money borrowed for the purchase of real estate. If a person owes money secured by a lien or mortgage on his home the amount of interest paid on such indebtedness may be deducted. However, interest need not be evidenced by a lien, judgment, or mortgage to make the interest thereon deductible. Frequently indebtedness is evidenced only by notes without additional security.

Interest paid on behalf of a friend or relative where there is no legal obligation on the part of the payer can not be deducted. In such cases the payment amounts to a loan or gift.

Since interest may be deducted, it follows that interest received is subject to income tax. Interest need not be received in cash, but it constructively received when credited and held subject to call. For example, interest credited to a taxpayer's savings account for the year 1926 is income for that year.

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AT THE THEATERS

Arcade Presents "Faust," a Screen Epic

An epic film, spectacular in the genuine sense of the word, deftly touched with humor and pathos that is genuine, comes to the Arcade theater. It is the latest UFA production, "Faust," which Mervyn Goldwyn-Mayer is releasing. Emil Jannings, Gustav Ekkman, Camilla Horn and Yvette Guilbert are featured in a cast that is excellent throughout. The minor roles are, as usual in imported pictures, extremely well played.

"Faust" is a film to remember always. It has the virility of melodrama, the persuasive quality of romance and the momentum of life.

The story is age-old, having been handed down from father to son for many years before Goethe and Marlowe conceived it to type, and much longer before Gounod composed his famous opera from the same legend. It is the age-old story of the struggle between good and evil, of temptation and virtue, and of the triumph of love.

In presenting "The Red Kimono" to the public, Mrs. Wallace Field has placed the blame where it most frequently belongs—on the ignorance and trust of the innocent victim rather than at the door of youthful delinquency—and makes her picture a lesson perhaps, a warning certainly, but never a punishment, unless her picture is a certain class of publicity-hungry idle rich could be considered in the light of a sermon against insincerity.
