YOUR INCOME TAX

Bad debts constitute a considerable item in the returns of many taxpayers and may be treated in one of two ways, either by deduction from gross income in respect to debts ascertained to be worthless in whole or in part, or by deduction from a reasonable reserve for bad debts. A taxpayer filing for the year 1924 a first return of income may select either method, subject to approval by the commissioner of internal revenue upon examination of the return. If the method selected is approved for subsequent years, except as permission may be granted by the commissioner to change.

Permission to adopt the reserve method is limited to taxpayers having a large number of accounts where credit has been extended to cover a considerable portion of time. It is not granted for the purpose of handling one specific debt.

What constitutes a "reasonable addition" to a reserve for bad debts must be determined in light of the facts, and will vary as between classes of business and with conditions of business prosperity. A taxpayer using the reserve method should show in his return the volume of business transactions for the year, and the percentage of the reserve to such amount, the total amount of notes and accounts receivable at the beginning and end of the taxable year, and the total amount of debts ascertained to be worthless and charged against the reserve during the taxable year.
