YOUR INCOME TAX No. 18

Net debts may be deducted from gross income in computing net income only for the year in which they are ascertained to be worthless and charged off the books of the taxpayer. The taxpayer should attach to his return a statement showing the propriety of any deduction claimed for bad debts.

Where the surrounding circumstances show that a debt is worthless and uncollectible, and that legal action, in all probability, would not avail, proof of these facts is sufficient of their worthlessness.

Unpaid loans made to relatives or friends with little or no expectation of their return are not deductible, but are regarded as gifts. If a debt is forgiven, it can not be claimed.

A valid debt proved to be worthless is not always a proper deduction. For example, unpaid amounts

representing wages, salaries or rentals, or similar items of taxable income are not allowed as deductions, unless included in the creditor's return for the year or in a previous year. The fact that expected income was not received does not decrease the amount of taxable income.

Partial deductions are allowed with respect to specific debts only. Amounts subsequently recovered on account of a part of such bad debts previously charged off and allowed for income tax purposes, must be included in gross income for the year in which received.
