HEAVIES READY TO ENTER RING

Jack Delaney and Jim Maloney to Fight It Out This Evening

NEW YORK, Feb. 18 (AP)—The paper fists of Jack Delaney, master of the light heavyweight realm, and the bludgeon strokes of Jim Maloney, Boston giant, tonight will mix at Madison Square Garden in one of the most picturesque heavyweight clashes ever staged indoors.

For ten rounds, two of the mightiest punchers in the fist kingdom are scheduled to hew away at an obstacle—each other—that blocks the trouble studded path to Gene Tunney's world title.

Thousands of dollars have been wagered at even money that a knock out before three-quarters of the route is passed, will send the winner flying ahead on the golden road of Tex Richards elimination tournament and the lower back to the foot of the heavyweight ladder.

Montana Takes Aggies Down in Missoula 38 to 25

MISSOULA, Mont., Feb. 18 (AP)—Showing unexpected strength, the University of Montana trounced the Oregon Aggies 38 to 25 here last night and sent the O. A. C. basketball team to Seattle to meet Washington in the last game of its road trip on Saturday.

The victory was the first for Montana in the Pacific coast conference this year. The grizzlies have lost 3 games and lost four, including a victory over Washington state college and a loss to Idaho this week.

5,000 of the 12,000 available tickets had fallen into the hands of speculators while 100,000 people sought tickets to the arena, speculators offered choice seats at prices as high as \$150 each.

The odds on Delaney were 3 to 2 with approximately \$500,000 already wagered. Odds of 1 to 2 were registered on Delaney to score a knockout, 1 to 4 that Maloney would win in that manner, and even money that the bout would not go the limit.

The popular impression that Delaney would win through his speed, ring craft and crushing right hand punch, appeared to govern the wagering. Maloney's supporters, steering the Boston slugger's weight advantage of 25 pounds, backed him to win through his tremendous strength and bruising drives to the body with both hands.
