**YOUR INCOME TAX**

No. 30

Charitable contributions and gifts are deductible within limitations provided by the revenue act of 1926. In order that deduction may be made, contributions to a corporation, trust, community chest, fund, or foundation must meet several tests. Such organization must be operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes, or for the prevention of cruelty to children and animals. No part of its income must inure to the benefit of private stockholders or individuals. Every church constitutes a religious corporation for the purpose of this deduction. Contributions made to a missionary fund, to church building funds, and for the benefit of other activities of the church are deductible. Pew rents, assessments, and dues paid to churches are regarded as contributions. Gifts to an individual are not deductible, but if made to a charitable organization, as defined by the revenue act, may be deducted.

even though the organization distributes the funds among individual beneficiaries. Gifts to any corporation or association organized or devoted to the advancement of learning are exempt.

Contributions or gifts made within the taxable year 1926 to the United States, the District of Columbia, any state or territory, any "political subdivision thereof" (city, town, county, or village), "exclusively public purposes" are deductible. A gift of real estate to a city to be maintained perpetually as a public park is deductible. Claims for deductions for contributions or gifts must be substantiated. Taxpayers are required to state in their returns the names and addresses of each organization to which a gift was made, the approximate date, and the amount of the gift in each case.

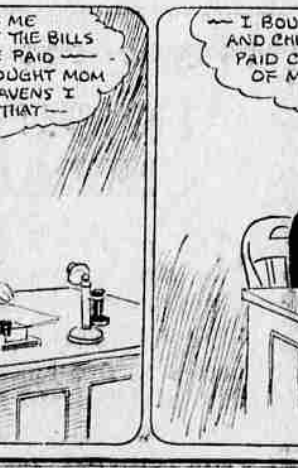
