Legislators are no different from the other people. We are all inclined to loaf along on a job as it gets under way, then work like Trojans when the time limit nears and cuss out the world in general if circumstances urge a few days overtime. All of the work that has been done or will be done could well have been accomplished in the allotted forty days—but to actually do it would show the world a model legislature and Oregon has political fame enough.

Patterson's veto of the Wilson toll road bill should be agreeable to everyone not expecting to use such a route every day. The toll road is all right, but the disturbance of the highway program to the extent of some two million dollars for this short stretch is all wrong. It would still not be too objectionable if experience did not teach us that after a year or two of tolls the motoring public would force the adoption of free usage. Not tolls, but regular highway funds would eventually pay for the road—and there are more logical places for the expenditure of the money at this particular time.

### RECOGNITION FOR PRUNES

With a \$300,000 advertising campaign launched in its behalf, the prune leaves the ranks of humble fruits and joins the aristocrats. It has long been recognized as a wholesome fruit. When properly prepared, it is also a palatable one. Prunes, like mothers-in-law, are not half so bad as the jokesmiths have pretended all these years. It was perhaps only its inevitability on the boarding house breakfast table, along with the knowledge that it was a cheap fruit, that made the prune so trying to the human soul.

Once let the advertising campaign make itself felt, with appetizing pictures of prunes and elegant prune dishes, with a prune slogan and prune recipes on every hand, and the curse will be removed. The popularized prunes may cost a little more, but they will be finer, perhaps, and therefore worth the cost.

A cheerful feature of this prospect is the fact that the well known prune really is good for us, though we may have our doubts about the prune soup to which Prince William of Sweden is said to be addicted. And prunes are good for this Northwest country especially, because the revenue they bring our growers is increasingly important.

### ECONOMY—FOR THE OTHER FELLOW

There are a few newspaper editorial writers who have a misconception of the meaning of economy. They indicate by their opinions that Oregon should be well satisfied and well served if it has a roof over its head and a fair supply of hardtack and salt pork in the cellar. Economy, they would have you believe, is hoarding every dang-blasted nickel and spending only when it is necessary to prevent life ebbing away. We would hate to inaugurate a like economy program in the news departments of their papers. What a howl there would be when all requests for additional features of merit were turned down, when existing features and departments were pruned and eliminated! They would call it suicide; they would predict a big circulation loss; they would point to the effect on advertisers. Practice economy, yes! but not in their department. That's always the way it goes. Such economy is, like prohibition, fine for the other fellow but impossible for them. And such economy is, we find, not economy at all, because economy is not merely a matter of not spending but of spending wisely—which is what we want in Oregon. Those things for which our tax money is spent should have merit. If they have none, we can do without them. We cannot, however, do without both for an indefinite period and expect the state to progress.

## CONDITIONS IN CHINA IMPROVE

### Summary Action Curbs Strikers—British Agree with Cantonese

Cantonese, who took Hangchow last week, continue steady drive on Shanghai.

"Reign of terror" in Shanghai which results in summary beheading of political and labor agitators by Chinese authorities produces swift decrease in strike activities, the number of those executed is variously estimated at from 28 to 30.

Marshal Chang Tso-Lin, Manchurian leader, who is driving through Honan province on the Cantonese, is temporarily held up when troops of General Wu-yet-Fu, nominal master of the province, disarm part of Chang's forces and seize ammunition train.

British Reach Agreement  
Great Britain, in agreement with Cantonese, will hand over the administration of Hankow and Kiangling to the nationalists who will establish a special Chinese municipality.

The agreement indicated that an effort will be made to amalgamate all foreign concessions at those places into one municipal district.

Negotiations are opened along similar lines with the northern government at Peking to apply the principles of the Hankow agreement throughout China.

London is Relieved  
London newspapers, although gratified by the signing of the Hankow agreement express worry over the Shanghai situation.

Foreign Secretary Chamberlain at London, tells house of commons he instructed British negotiators at Hankow to inform Cantonese Great Britain must reserve full right to dispose of her troops as may be necessary for the protection for British life.

A mob of boys and loafers stoned British billets in Shanghai, but were driven off by police.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 21. (AP)—Official reports from Shanghai to the state department today said there had been no anti-foreign tendency disclosed in the labor strikes in that area.

## Six Guardsmen Lost in Sea Off Massachusetts

PROVINCETOWN, Mass., Feb. 21 (AP)—Somewhere in the churning sea of High Hold today were the bodies of six members of the crew of the coast guard patrol boat 238, who lost by a single hour a plucky all-night fight against death in one of the wildest northwesterly storms that has scourged Cape Cod in nearly 30 years. The boat had been out looking for rum runners.

Two bodies were pulled from the raging surf late yesterday, a few hours after the craft, disabled in motor power and radio, had been

DUTTON'S LANDING, Cal. (NEA)—An Amazon paradise, the only one of its kind, and 40,000 acres in extent, exists in the Subsum sloughs of the Sacramento river near here.

Here is the only exclusive women's hunting club in the United States—probably the world. It is an island, separated by some miles of water from the nearest masculine hunting club. Efforts civilization may claim the majority of society women to bridge tables and tea affairs, but here are gathered in duck hunting season the hardy spirits among San Rafael and San Francisco society women. These Amazons rise before dawn, endure hardships only comparable to those of the explorer, and emerge from their sport with their due complement of wild ducks—all for the sport of it.

At 5 o'clock Sunday afternoon the craft was sighted through the murk of the blizzard. Flashing blinker lights told observers ashore that the engines had gone dead and its radio was powerless.

Destroyers to Rescue  
Soon two destroyers were steaming to sea from Boston, under forced draft with two cutters following closely.

At that time the 238 was three miles off shore with two anchors overboard and a tremendous sea running. Crews from three guard stations paced the shore with guns and breeches buoys, waiting for the chance to rescue that was never to come.

The appearance of a large steamer but a short distance away gave momentary hope to the anxious watchers on shore. The guardsmen signalled frantically to the steamer, which kept at its course and soon disappeared. Then the storm swallowed the 238 and she disappeared from sight of those on shore.

Watch Stops  
Twelve hours after she first had been sighted and with the racing destroyers less than an hour away the picket boat and those aboard met their fate. A watch on the body of one of the men swept ashore had stopped at 5 a. m.

Smith had also given \$15,000 to the local Cook county campaign, he refused to answer questions as to who the money was paid to. Additional testimony adduced today showed that Insull spent a minimum of \$227,925 in the republican primary.
