YOUR INCOME TAX

No. 31

Pensions paid by a corporation or individual to retired employees for services rendered are taxable. Pensions paid by the United States government are also taxable, except as provided by the revenue act of 1924, which exempts amounts received as compensation for military or naval service, or as a pension for services rendered by the beneficiary or another for which the state is paying a pension.

Allowances, whether paid by the federal or state government, or private individuals to one who performed no duties, as, for example, a widow in recognition of services rendered by her husband, are regarded as gifts and are not taxable.

A bonus paid by a state to its residents who served in the military or naval services during the war with Germany does not constitute taxable income.

Benefits paid by a labor union to members while on strike are to be included in the income, subject to tax, of such members.

An allowance paid a retired clergyman by the governing body of a religious denomination is taxable income.

Sun Worshipers Found in Armenia

LENINAIKAN, Soviet Armenia, Feb. 21 (A.E.)—While carrying the relief work in the Armenian earthquake zone, American nurses attached to the Near East Relief Organization discovered a hitherto unknown race of Sun worshippers.

These people, who call themselves "Idis," live in 14 scattered villages on the slopes of the giant volcanic mountain Ararat. They are believed to be the only survivors of the only surviving Sun worshippers in Europe.

Coming originally from the little known and mysterious Persian Mountains, the Idis have retained for centuries their native religious customs and beliefs, jealously guarding against any intrusion of outsiders or of intercourse with other people. The American nurses spoke to them in Armenian, but found they understood only their own idiom, which resembles slightly the Kurdish tongue.

The Idis women are singularly beautiful, and dress in gay, colorful skirts. In their noses they wear large barbaric rings.

The Sun worshippers are governed by a "Sheik," who at the same time is their religious director. They perform their religious ceremonies only on the summit of the highest mountain, where their Sun-God is nearly always visible and where no profane eyes intrude.

FRENCH LAW HAMPERS SPORTS OF CHILDREN

Sporting development in the schools of France is retarded by an old law making teachers morally and civilly responsible for accidents to pupils while in their care. Parents may recover damages from a teacher for an accident to their child if the teacher is at fault in any way. Teachers, therefore, are careful not to engage in any school activities not covered by the government's outline of school work. One of the largest schools in Paris requires parents to sign a formal release from all responsibility for the child in sports before the pupil can join the school athletic association.

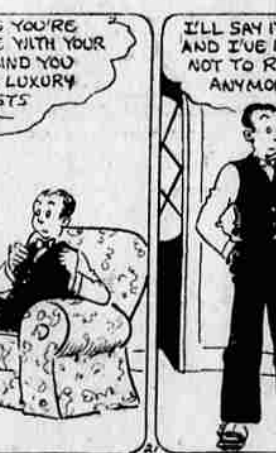
