

OREGON APPLES MORE IN DEMAND

Shipments This Season at 5,811 Carloads, Better Last Year

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 21 (AP)—Oregon has shipped a total of 5,811 carloads of apples this season up to Feb. 12. This compares with 4,323 carloads up to the same time last year and to a total of 4,702 cars last season. It appears now that total shipments this season will run well over 6,000 carloads.

Export fancy stocks, however, are showing the windily and will soon be at a premium. Wholesale markets are still well supplied with commercial grades that tend to prevent values from working higher. There is a good demand throughout the country and stocks are steadily moving in to consumption. The two-cent advance in price for the local market, however, is not reflected in the local market. Packaged wrapped prints were being quoted 52 cents, creamery basis, with cartons at 53 cents. Butterfat bids have been boosted a cent by cream layers and now range from 49 to 50 cents in the country to 52 and 53 cents in the local market.

Buttermilk continues bearish in the local egg market although values are generally unchanged at the opening of the week.

The potato market maintains a steady tone. Buying continues and a fairly active basis in the country with offers ranging around \$1.50 for good commercial stock. Country dressed meats and poultry were on a nominal basis this morning with few new arrivals and not enough trading to establish definite prices.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Feb. 19 (AP)—Horse and dog racing in Florida—upon which the interest of all track followers has been centered the last several months—will be a lively topic at the April session of the state legislature.
