FRENCH WOMEN TO GET EQUALITY IN SCHOOLS

Women have practically won their right to be regarded as men's equals in the educational world of France. Edouard Herriot, minister of public instruction, promises gradual reforms in normal schools to put women on the same basis as men. The war altered the French attitude toward woman, but the fight has been going on for 50 years.

Woman has had a fair chance to be schooled and to teach in France for several generations, but what she wants and what she is about to get is the obligation to take the same courses, pass the same tests and get the same diploma as men. Heretofore the French effort has been to offer the women an easier way through school, eliminating, for instance, the study of Greek.

Alarmed British women are beginning to write to the London papers complaining of falling out and discoloration of their hair since they followed the craze of bobbed and shingled heads. One says she is "a sadder and wiser woman" now that she finds her hair "fresher" and darker and coarser at the back of the neck.
