HILL'S

Home of Judge Robbed Because He Ignored Note

NEW YORK, Feb. 25 (AP)—Threats that the home of Judge Palmer, former city court judge, would be blown up unless he paid \$5,000 to the writers of anonymous letters were followed early today by the explosion of a bomb in front of his home in Brooklyn.

The family, including four children, asleep when the blast occurred, escaped injury. Windows in the front of the home were shattered. The property in one of the three plans along Ocean Parkway, the home had been hidden in shrubbery in front of the house.

Threats of death against the judge and his family were made against Harry E. Holt, president of the Merchants National Bank of Brooklyn, and Dr. Hart H. Harrington, prominent Brooklyn physician, police revealed today. Police guards were assigned the two men while a search for defectors sought the writers of letters containing the demands.

Hardships Cause College Suicides

BERKELEY, Cal., Feb. 25 (AP)—Dr. W. W. Campbell, of the University of California, believes that the suicide epidemic among eastern college students may be due to depression brought on by hardships endured during the winter.

"Many students undergo hardships in winter, and a state of depression, caused, perhaps, by lack of sleep, lack of food, or lack of heat or clothing, is the natural result," said Dr. Campbell. "The fact that no student tragedies of this nature have happened in California, where we have no such wintering season, would support this theory."

BEGGAR CONVICTED

NEW YORK—Horton Malone, beggar who in dress clothes has been going to parties from his hotel while in a \$2,000 car, which Mrs. Malone has been wearing at Miami, is to spend a month in the workhouse, detectives who nabbed the substantial beggar on him as he peddled himself last evening on a little rubber platform covered by wax taping in about \$7.50 a week.

VERSATILE RUNNER AGAIN

Newspaper Loser In Picture Case

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25 (AP)—Unauthorized publication by a newspaper of the photograph of a private person violates "the right of privacy" and makes the newspaper liable for damages, Justice Sutherland, of the District of Columbia supreme court, held today.

Justice Sutherland said the newspaper could not invade the privacy of the person in defense of the publication of unauthorized pictures of private persons.

The case was brought against the Washington Times company by Maudie Ford in Feb. 1924.

Willamette River Drops Half a Foot

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 25 (AP)—The Willamette river dropped from 18 feet to 17.5 during last night, indicating that the flood, due to drainage of the up-state high water had passed its crest.

The news brought relief to downtown business here, panic stricken since yesterday when a log raft tore away more than 20 houses at the Long Island wharves, most of them in more or less damaged condition, had been recovered or located except two, which either sank or were washed into the estuary.
