### LEGISLATORS WORKING OUT TAX PROGRAM

(Continued from Page One)

add five per cent to the department. The legislature will likely end its labors with adjournment sine die about midnight tonight. A short cut will likely be taken in the house this afternoon through pro-

posals for indefinite postponements on a number of senate bills proposing salary increases. The governor has consistently vetoed such measures, and house leaders feel it is wasted time to debate over them.

### MAY ADJOURN AT MIDNIGHT

STATE HOUSE, SALEM, Ore., Feb. 25 (AP)—Having practically agreed upon a taxation program, which includes the state income tax already passed, a revised tithe-

ing bill amended so as to reimburse the highway department for funds taken from it in the present financial emergency and an amendment to the constitution whereby the base of the six per cent tax limitation would be able to adjourn sine die at midnight.

The house today defeated the proposed tobacco tax, and planned to kill off a number of senate bills proposing salary increases which members thought the governor would veto if passed.
