Lenten Season Is Observed in Local Churches

Episcopal and Lutheran Denominations Hold Special Services Appropriate for Period.

Observance of the Lenten season is being featured in several local churches this week. The period of lent began Wednesday and will continue until Easter Sunday. Two weekday services were held in St. Peter's Episcopal church and tomorrow's services at the Zion Lutheran church will appropriately observe the event.

Episcopal Church
The Episcopal church Sunday program begins at 8 a. m. with holy eucharist and church school meets at 9:45 a. m. At 11 a. m. choral celebration of the Holy Communion will be followed by a sermon on "The Operation of Power." The evening mission service will feature an address "The Man Born Blind."

The divine healing class meets at 4:15 and the Wayfarer's guild will meet at 5:45 p. m. The guild will hold another debate at that time.

Lutheran Church
The Lutheran Sunday school meets at 9:45 a. m. with classes graded for all ages. The Lenten season will be appropriately observed in sermon and song during the day. At the morning worship the pastor, the Rev. Edw. H. Aves, will preach on "On the Jerusalem Way With Jesus." The choir will sing the anthem "Come Unto Me All Ye That Labor."

A "Life Service" program is to be given in the evening, beginning at 7 o'clock.

The second Lenten mid-week service will be held at the parsonage Wednesday, Mar. 9, at 7:30 o'clock. The pastor will speak on the subject "The Drawing Power of the Cross."

Christian Church
Bible school will meet at 9:45 a. m. Everyman's class convening in the city hall.

During the morning worship hour the minister will present the cause of Christian missions and an offering will be taken.

The junior church is reported to be doing splendid work under the leadership of Mrs. Frank Harnes and Miss Gertrude Wagner. The minister always has an object for the boys and girls of the junior church.

Christian Endeavor societies will meet at 8:30 o'clock in the evening. "A Critical Situation Successfully Met" will be the subject of the
