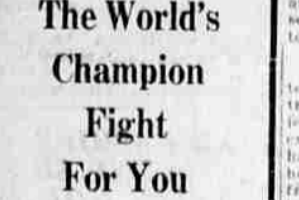
FLOATING HOTELS MAY

KANSAS COACH TURNS  
OUT WINNING TEAMS

WICHITA, Kan., Mar. 10—With a school population of only 110 to draw from, Ellis Cummings, coach at Cathedral high school here has an exceptional record for building winning teams.

The football teams have won 13 out of 24 games in the past three years, his basketball teams won 63 out of 82 games, and his tennis teams have not lost a match in two seasons. The girls' basketball team, which he also coaches, won 24 out of 42 games.

Cummings will direct the national high school girls' basketball tournament here March 22 to 26. Twenty-four of the best girls' teams in the country have entered for the Westfield Challenge Trophy, now held by Sharon, Pa.

TAMPA, Fla., March 10—Washington players are pulling for Peckinpaugh, their former teammate, to be the regular shortstop of the Chicago White Sox, and they believe he will.

"Peck had a good rest and should be in great shape this year," they say. "If he doesn't get hurt, nobody can keep him out. He can play and think, too."

Peckinpaugh is teamed with Aaron Ward, who is certain to play second, making a former New York double play combination effective again.

Farm  
Pointers

Spraying with oil emulsions in February, or until apple bud tips show green, controls red spider mites in Oregon, says Don C. Mote, entomologist of the experiment station. An 8 per cent oil emulsion is the standard spray. When commercial miscible oils are used dilutions are made according to directions on the can.

Spraying with lime sulfur, 10 to 12 gallons of concentrated solution in 100 gallons of water, controls scale insects on juniper, according to Oregon experiment station authorities. Applications are made in the dormant season—February and early March. This pest is not serious in Oregon but is often hard to control.

Diseased colonies of bees are often moved to a hospital yard for treatment, according to H. A. Scullion, bee specialist at the Oregon experiment station. This practice has many good points but often the hospital yard becomes a grave yard for bees. Hospital yards are located close to home so that they may receive careful attention. They are not placed too close to colonies of other beekeepers.

Poison bait controls earwigs on flowering plants in Oregon, according to experiment station authorities. Bait is made up of sodium fluoride, 12 ounces, molasses 2 quarts, wheat bran 12 pounds, and water 6 quarts. This is scattered so that no large lumps remain as sodium fluoride is poisonous. This pest is serious and devours vegetables, fruits, and garden flowers.
