

POTATO MARKET IS NEAR WINDUP

Little Hopes Held for Flurry—Butter Mart Firm and Higher

PORTLAND, Ore., Mar. 10 (AP).—Very little hopes are held now of a flurry in the potato market in the final wind-up of the 1926 crop. Instead it appears now as if the close will be peaceful with little change in current values.

In the Pacific northwest primary markets trading is steady with prices on a stable basis. The change has been shown during the past 30 days. Some growers still have hopes of higher prices and are holding, but buyers have little trouble filling their requirements.

Buyers in the local field report little activity in the producing sections tributary to Portland. A moderate volume of business is being done at \$1.50 to \$1.60 for U. S. No. 1 Burbanks in the country. These prices generally include sacks and hauling.

There is very little top grade.
