SALEM BIG TEST FOR LA GRANDE

Tigers to Face 1926 State Champions This Evening at 7:30 O'clock

When La Grande defeated Wasco at Salem last night 43 to 16, it was a signal triumph for Eastern Oregon in that this is the first time in four or five years that a team

Joseph Wallowa, Baker and La Grande all fell in the initial contest in the past four years. Baker won later in the consolation tournament but this is the first time that Eastern Oregon entry has remained in the championship flight.

Big Test Tonight
Receipt of word here of the victory last night resulted in widespread rejoicing and also in realization that the really big test of the tournament faces the Tigers tonight when they clash with Salem high at 7:30 o'clock.

The general opinion is that if La Grande can overcome the 1926 state champions, they will be in a fair way to go on through without defeat. A loss from Salem, however, would drop La Grande into the consolation tournament with nothing to play for but third and fourth places.

Coach Ian MacKenzie used every man on his squad last night and had left the first five in, the score would probably have been much larger.

Lyman High Point Man
Captain Mose Lyman is high point man of the tournament at the end of the first day's play with 28 markers. Maikenin, of Astoria, is second with 18.

Local fans believe that La Grande has a slight edge over Salem in one respect at least--while Salem was facing a strong opponent last night, one that forced her to the limit, La Grande was competing through an easy opponent, at the same time getting used to the Willamette university gym floor.

It is also said that La Grande has one of the largest rooting sections on hand at Salem. As last night, results of the Salem-La Grande game may be obtained by calling 446-M.
