WASHINGTON, Mar. 17, (AP)—The war department has made public prices and harbor allotments for the fiscal year beginning July 1. They aggregate \$42,000,000. The remainder of the lump sum appropriation made by the last congress, has been reserved to meet emergencies or for future allotment.

Items of \$700,000 to \$1,000,000 include: Coos Bay, Ore., \$750,000. Other allotments included: In Oregon: Coquille river \$24,000; Coos river, Oregon \$3,000; Siuslaw river \$48,000; Tillamook Bay and river \$24,000; Clatskanie river \$7,000.

Snake river, Idaho, Oregon and Washington \$7,000; Columbia and lower Willamette rivers, below Vancouver, Wash., and Portland, Ore. \$250,000.

Willamette river above Portland and Yamhill river Oregon \$48,728.
