

RAILS IN FAVOR IN WALL STREET

Speculators Switch from Industrials in the Stock Exchange

NEW YORK, Mar. 21 (AP).—Switching of speculative interest from industrials to rails gave today's stock market a firmer upturn. Early breaks of two to five points in a number of industrials and specialties were substantially reduced or wiped out by end of the third hour, but trading was rather dull on the rally.

The unexpectedly low figure of cotton ginnings for the 1926-27 crop which brought about a rally of \$2.50 to \$3.00 a bale in cotton futures, was generally construed as bullish on the stock market also.

Sudden demand for rails was not associated with anything special in the day's news but was regarded as the usual maneuver of professional operators when the industrial group goes stale.

Despite success of bear traders in unsettling a number of industrials and specialties in early trading, pool activities were continued in a number of specialties. President Street car in which the Whelan interests recently acquired a large interest, International Match preferred and trade all were on the break demand.

This tended to heaviness as the result of another cut in export gasoline prices. Motors sold down at the start on announcement that Henry Ford had cut prices on the Lincoln car and of rumors that he would shortly bring out a two-cylinder Ford model, but they rallied later under leadership of General Motors and Hudson.

The closing was steady. Sustained buying of the railroad and reversion of public utilities facilitated the upward trend in the last hour in which U. S. Steel and General Motors got well over 100 and 175, respectively. Commercial Solvents "B" touched a new peak at 27 3/4. Total sales approximated 1,850,000 shares.

Market Steady Generally; Price Range Is Same

PORTLAND, Ore., Mar. 21 (AP).—Market conditions in the Portland wholesale district were generally steady today with but light trading during the fore part of the day. Prices ranged practically the same as Saturday in all lines of country meats, poultry, butter, eggs and vegetables.

Poultry dealers started the day with their supplies pretty well cleaned up, due to a lively demand over the week end. Poultry live hens are holding their price range of from 22 to 25 cents, according to weight.

A large part of the current butter and egg receipts continue to be stored by local dealers with prices firm at Saturday's relatively low figures, made in sympathy with California's lowered market.
