WESTERN TEAMS WIN IN CHICAGO

All But One of the Southern Entries Beaten in First Day's Play

CHICAGO, Mar. 29. (AP)—Better marksmanship by the basket shooters of the London, Kentucky high school team gave them a 29 to 20 victory over Stanford, Arizona, in the first clash between the teams which opened the national interscholastic basketball tournament here today.

The east-west struggle which dotted the opening rounds of the national interscholastic basketball tournament were decided in favor of the westerners in the opening round of competition at the University of Chicago. All but one southern squad in the first day's play of 13 hours yesterday went down to defeat, the Vienna, Ga., team standing out in its sole victory for the south as a foe to be reckoned with in the later rounds.

Vienna today meets another of the teams which stood out prominently the first day, Winfield, Kan., one of the heaviest and most finished teams of the 42 which began the elimination series yesterday morning.

The Garden

TIMELY HINTS

Put down Golden Bantam corn in the seed order. The garden isn't complete without it. Get a good strain from a reliable seed house.

Order perennial seeds and plant them early. The larger the plants this fall the more certain to bloom next year.

The home cook is learning that leeks are good to eat and valuable for stews and soups. The professional chef has known it for years. Grow a row of leeks. Large-Musselburg is a standard sort and Long Mesieres a favorite.

Mignonette is a good little head lettuce to try if you have given up hope on the big fellows.

Dahlia-flowered zinnias are too gorgeous to overlook and they will succeed where real dahlias will not.

If you wish a curiosity on the back fence plant a turra or dishcloth gourd. The fiber holding the seeds makes a fine bath sponge as well as a dish cloth. You can raise your own sponges.

Austrian Plum mustard is a fine plant for greens. It is handsome growing and crisp and excellently flavored.

Try some of the new extra early round-seeded peas such as Market Surprise to get a jump on the pea season.

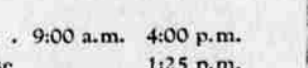
