Father of R.F.D. Passes At Home In Washington

WASHINGTON, Mar. 30. (AP)—Perry S. Heath, known as the "father of the rural free delivery" and for years prominent as an editor and publisher, died at his home here early today after an illness of more than six weeks.

A picturesque figure in the last quarter of the 19th century as a newspaper man and prolific political writer, Mr. Heath entered the post office department in 1897 under President McKinley, and with less than \$20,000 authorized by congress for experimental purposes, he started the first work on one of the greatest advancements in postal distribution in history.

When he resigned three years later as assistant postmaster general the rural delivery service he had established was costing about \$425,000 a year. In 1925 the cost was \$102,000,000. His 1200 letter carriers roaming the remote farm centers in 1900 have jumped to more than 45,000 at the present time.
