Dried Apricot Betty
Two cups rolled toasted bread crumbs, 1 cup granulated sugar, 2 tablespoons melted butter, 2 cups steamed dried apricots.
Combine crumbs, sugar and melted butter, mixing thoroughly. Put a layer into a well-buttered baking dish and add a layer of fruit. Continue layer for layer, making the last one of crumbs until all is used. Cover dish and bake in a slow oven for 40 minutes. Remove cover and brown top. Serve warm with whipped cream or hard sauce.
