CONSIDER WHEAT BEST CASH CROP

Federal Report Touches Upon Farmers' Prob- lems in East Oregon

Wheat offers the best of the cash crop opportunities for success in the dry-land area of Eastern Oregon, declares the bureau of agricultural economics, United States department of agriculture, announcing the results of a survey of costs and earnings on wheat farms in that region.

Perhaps the greatest improvements may be made, says the bureau, in the reduction of production costs through more efficient management of the labor program, employment of the right size and proper type of machinery, and the proper choice of motive power. The problem involves also the production of more of the feed crops for the livestock and the production of a large proportion of the family food supplies.

Growing wheat by the summer fallow method in this region permits the farmer to operate a relatively large area, since a relatively long period of time is provided by this system in which to prepare the land for seeding. Favorable climate allows the wheat to stand for two to three weeks after it is ripe, without shattering, and provides a much longer harvesting season than in more humid areas.

The question of the best size of farm unit, says the bureau, is dependent largely on the experience and managerial ability of the farmer, but at least a section of land is needed on which to make use of man labor, work stock and equipment, and the larger volume of sales are the factors mainly responsible for the increased earnings on the larger farms in this area.

Full details of the survey have been published in Department Bulletin No. 1446-D, "Cost of producing winter wheat and incomes from wheat farming in Sherman county, Oregon," copies of which may be obtained from the department of agriculture, Washington, D. C.

Stray Dog Big Factor; Spreads Rabies Quickly

The stray dog is the main factor in the spread of rabies or hydrophobia. The "mad" or rabid dog is infected with rabies, and during the "furious" or biting stage of this disease will terrorize a community. In Oregon the stray dog may be attacked by rabid coyotes. Stray dogs frequently bite the human dog and in this way the infection may enter the home. Rabies is communicated from a rabid or mad animal through a wound usually produced by biting. Rabies is a rapidly fatal paralytic infection. Man always contracts the disease from lower animal, commonly the dog.

In civilized communities dogs are subject to license and to definite rules for control so that measures may promptly be taken when rabies has been introduced into the community. Rabies may be controlled and even exterminated by intelligent means directed towards the eradication of rabies in dogs.

The chief requirement for the control of rabies is the impounding of all stray dogs and the proper supervision of all licensed dogs. All dogs should be licensed and required to wear a tag, and under

certain circumstances, restrained by a chain or leash. Strange dogs should be impounded and owners less dogs killed. It is the stray dog that keeps rabies alive. Muzzling and other mechanical measures of restraint become necessary when rabies is known to exist in a community. It is a mistake to kill a dog immediately after it has bitten someone. The dog should be shut up for ten days and watched carefully to see if symptoms of rabies develop.

Owners should be held legally responsible for damages inflicted by dogs. Education of the dog-owning public helps toward preventing the spread of communicable diseases, especially rabies. All cases of suspected rabies should be immediately reported.

The dog can be immunized against rabies. The immunization of all dogs when licensed and the impounding or killing of all stray

dogs should effectively control rabies.

Bites by rabid animals or animals suspected of being rabid may be cauterized with fuming nitric acid. The method is helpful if within forty-eight hours, but the earlier the better. In case of bites on the face there is especial need for immediate treatment with fuming nitric acid, for the action of rabies virus may be so rapid that the Pasteur treatment will not have time to take full effect. Properly used nitric acid should not cause bad scarring. Every person bitten by a rabid animal, or an animal suspected of being rabid, should take the Pasteur treatment.
