Eastern Oregon Champs May Have Hard Job to Retain Laurels

La Grande high school Eastern Oregon champion in 1925 and 1926, will receive its baptism of fire this Saturday afternoon when the Baker high track and field team will be opponents in a dual meet.

Baker is reported to have a strong team this year and the Tigers are expected to have to go the limit to defeat the Bulldogs. Baker is stronger in the sprints, according to reports, and will give the champions a hard run in the distances and weights.

Coach Ian MacKenzie, with the class meet ended, excepting two events which will be run off Tuesday to get a line on what time can be expected—hopes to be able to put a well-balanced team in the field before the annual East Oregon meet at Baker May 7.

Several strong men, including Charlton, Keffer, Lyman, Smutz and others, are sure point winners and around these men the coach expects to build up a team that should have an even chance with any other team in the annual classic.

The loss of Tubby Zundel, who won around 20 points in the 1926 Eastern Oregon meet, is a distinct blow to the team this year.

The meet here Saturday is to be called at 7:15 o'clock, the first events to be the 100-yard dash, the mile run and the pole vault.

Man Faces Charge Of Killing Woman KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Apr. 13 (AP)—James H. Grayson, elderly Modoc county California farmer, was bound over to the Klamath county grand jury yesterday on the charge of murdering his daughter-in-law, Mrs. Myrtle Grayson, on the streets of Malibu, March 26.

Grayson offered no testimony on his behalf but his attorney moved for dismissal of the charges holding that the state's own witnesses showed indisputably that the shot was either fired accidentally or was intended for John Sullivan.

Witnesses for the state told of threats which Grayson had uttered against his daughter-in-law and Sullivan. It was said that Grayson had been laboring under the illusion that Sullivan was infatuated with Mrs. Grayson whereas Sullivan was engaged to Mrs. Grayson's sister.

Bachelors Fear Women at Polls

GLASGOW, Scotland, Apr. 13 (AP)—What will happen to bachelor members of the house of commons when the woman vote becomes stronger than the male vote? Sir Robert Horne, who represents the Hillhead district of Glasgow, is among the unmarried members of parliament who are facing this problem.

At present men and women voters run neck and neck in the district. There are 14,182 women and 14,862 men who are qualified voters.

But if all women over 21 get the ballot on the same terms as men, women voters will far outnumber men. In fact, political leaders believe there will probably not be a contest in the British Isles, where there will not be more women than men voting when they are put on an equal footing.

At present there are 12,667,261 men electors and 8,587,121 women electors in Great Britain. There are nearly 2,000,000 more women than men in England.
