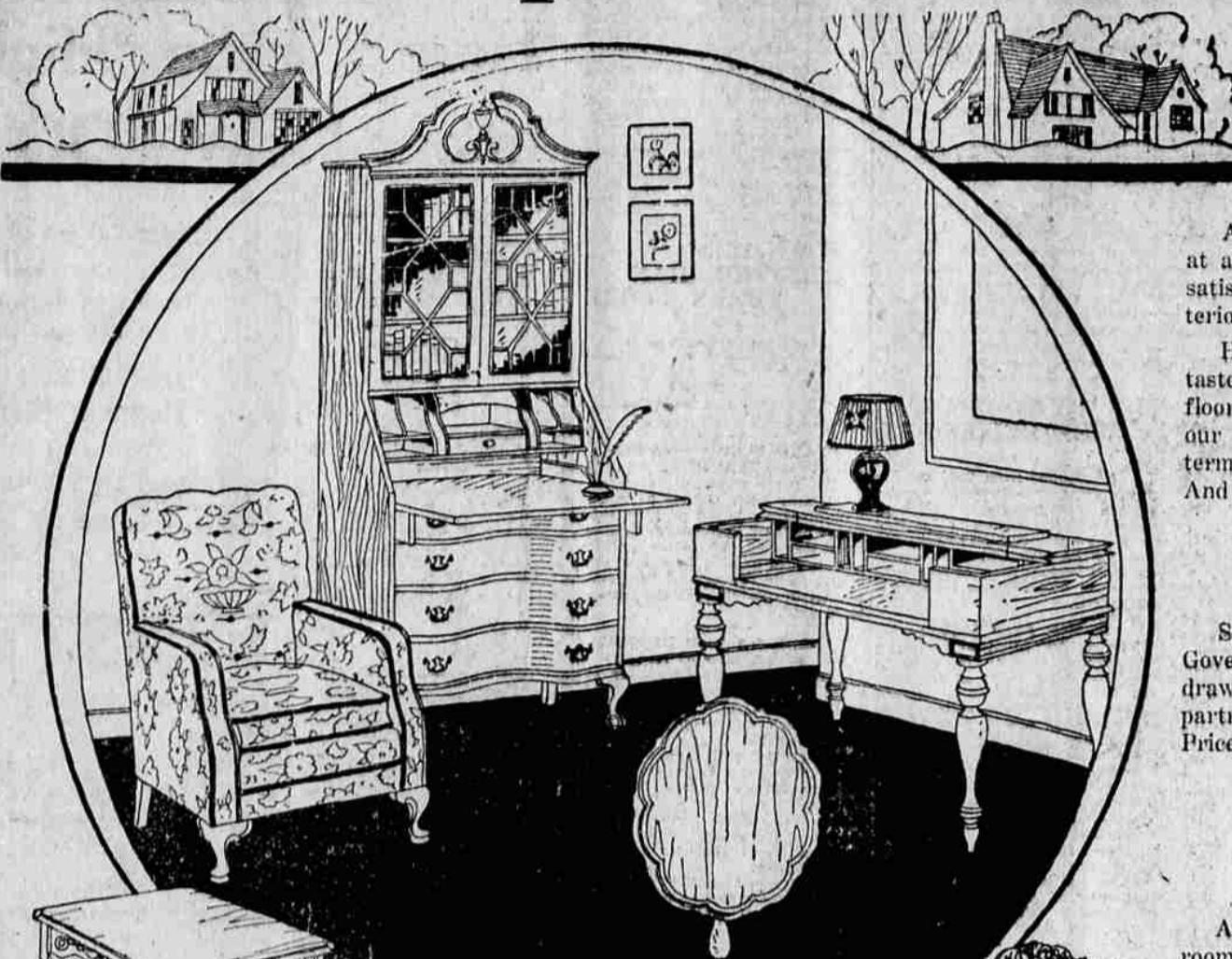


Jefferson Was Born Day Like This April, 1843

By the Associated Press. First chief executive to be inaugurated at Washington. Thomas Jefferson, is remembered as much for his presidential activities as for his popular eight year administration from 1801 to 1809. He was born April 13, 1743, in Virginia, the seat of original rebellion, and has to his honor the actual writing and signing of the Declaration of Independence, whose fiftieth birthday, July 4, 1826, marked his death at Monticello. He was a member of the Philadelphia congress which gave birth to the republic and also of the committee that chose the union seal and legend, "E pluribus unum." Jefferson's first official act as third president of the United States emphasized his principles of free speech and democracy. He pardoned every prisoner under the sedition laws and abolished all official practice of royalism. He made a bargain for the United States by purchasing Louisiana from France in 1803 for \$15,000,000 but his embargo of 1807 against both England and Spain wrought great hardship on commercial coastal states. Thomas Jefferson is recognized as the founder of the present democratic party, a paradox in politics, for he was leader of the original republican party, known as the anti-federalists. Dr. Nicholas Murray Butler will be the principal speaker at the celebration today at Monticello and at the University of Virginia, which Jefferson founded, when students will present scenes from Jefferson's life. The scenes will include his departure from Monticello to accept the presidential nomination; Hempswood Lodge, his first home in Monticello after his marriage; a lawn dance when he played the violin, and a scene with his duplicating machine at the first revolving topped desk, each his invention.

The Garden

THE GARDEN FULL OF POPPIES

Mrs. Louise Boebe Wilder in her fine book, "Adventures in My Garden and Rock Garden," coined a term that has become a part of gardening language, "poppy magic." A sentence in her chapter on "Poppy Magic" summarizes the charm of one of the finest garden annuals and one of the very easiest to grow, so easy that seed may be scattered at any time of the year with certainty of a crop. Here is the sentence: "A French painter once said that it is not possible to imitate upon canvas the recent brilliant colors of poppies in sunshine; nor can words give any idea of their flash and delicacy; only in a garden full of them where they may be observed year after year through every phase of their lovely development, in all their wayward moods, in sunshine and shadow, storm and tranquillity, can one realize their infinite grace and variety, the magic of their vivid, flashing charm."

After Mrs. Wilder's poppy chapter there is little left to say by way of description. The Shirley poppies are favorites in the garden for their grace and great variety of coloring, new blue shades now being added, with a bewildering variety of the most delicate and tissue-like pinks, salmon and roses to flaming scarlets and rich maroons. Then there are the Iceland poppies that send up their hairy buds before frost is fairly out of the ground. They add brilliant yellow to the poppy colors.

The poppy cousins of California, the Escholtzias, give brilliant yellows and oranges. The tall tree California poppy, the Hemanthia, gives still more brilliant yellow. The one thing to remember about poppies is that it is practically useless to try to transplant them. Sow where they are to bloom. Sow thickly and give them about eight inches of room. Mix the seed with several times its bulk of sand to make thin planting easy. You can scatter poppy seed even on the snow in the garden. It will come up bright and early. It is one of the hardiest of annuals and small plants often survive the winter. Order plenty of poppy seed and try some of the new strains.

DO YOU WISH TO GET TUBERCULOSIS? By J. E. Bush, M. D., Lexington, Ky. Member Gorgas Memorial Institute

To be absolutely sure of an early consummation of your desire it is best to go back at least two generations and choose your grandparents. Collect four such whom you have reason to believe will pass on to their children certain characteristics, such as stooped shoulders (with lack of space for the proper expansion of the lungs), outstretched neck (indicating weak and going until fatigued), a desire to avoid all kinds of outdoor exercise, fear of fresh air, and other factors that produce an unhealthy, puny individual. Let us hope now that these characteristics which predispose to tuberculosis will be inherited by you, and then you are sure that the soil (your body) is fertile for the growth of the little plant which causes tuberculosis as soon as this little plant gains entrance to your body.

Of course, the plant can't grow unless the seed is sown and one can't get tuberculosis, no matter how weak he may be, until he has had the organism introduced into his system. Grass doesn't usually grow there if the track is deserted for a time, and if the grass seeds are introduced, but it will never grow unless the seeds are introduced. These statements bring to mind the old idea (even now frequently heard) that living over damp cellars will cause tuberculosis, or getting one's feet wet will cause pneumonia. Would you think that given any sort of conditions (such as the damp cellar or wet feet) that one could produce a mouse or a pony? Of course not. For you realize that all living things must have parents and if this is true, as it surely is, then the living plant which causes tuberculosis must come from other like plants. The plant causing tuberculosis will grow most easily in the "weakened" body such as we have asked you to choose, but it will grow on the "race track" (resistant or healthy body) if conditions are right. Similarly, the weakened body will never become a prey to tuberculosis unless the microscopic plant causing tuberculosis is introduced. In addition to selecting a fertile soil (unhealthy body) from our forebears, in order to be sure of the end result, we must go one step further and introduce into this body the organism of the growth of the little plant which causes tuberculosis. This is best and which causes tuberculosis as soon as this little plant gains entrance to your body.

Tuberculosis is preventable! Remember that even healthy people and well born individuals frequently die of tuberculosis because they have been exposed to the infection. The individual with an inherited tendency toward tuberculosis would, if he avoided infection, never have taken the disease and could not have become a victim of the "white plague."
