New York's Yankees are off in the lead of the big league pack. Turning on the steam at the season's start they apparently are out to clinch the pennant in the early games as they did last year. In the first two games of the season the Yankee batteries swung so effectively against the veteran Athletics that the Huggins clan today looks down upon the other teams of the league as the only ones far to chalk up two in the winning column. The Yanks got 16 hits off four Athletic pitchers yesterday.

Haines in Good Form
Some world-beating pitching was exhibited in the comeback of the champion Cardinals in Chicago where Jess Haines, hero of last fall's world series, held the Cubs to two hits in nine innings. The Cubs were shut out 5 to 0, evening the count for the first two games.

One of these lightning finishes you read about but seldom see enabled the Chicago White Sox to score 6 runs in the ninth and beat out the Indians at Cleveland 7 to 2. Three errors at crucial moments spoiled defeat for the Robins 4 to 2 at the hands of the Braves. Eight other eager teams in four cities were disappointed when rain forced cancellation of two games in each of the leagues.

JESS SWEETSER'S HEALTH IMPROVING

ATLANTA—Jess Sweetser, who collapsed after winning the British amateur championship last year, has been improving in health during a year's stay in Asheville, N. C., although he is not yet ready for tournament play.

He showed that he was very much on his feet by winning the best ball match, playing with Bobby Cruikshank, with a 64 for the 18 holes in the preliminaries to the Southern Open here. He dropped out of the tournament in order to conserve his health. Sweetser has been playing moderately in Asheville and entered the tournament to test his condition.

ONLY THREE PILOTS WEAR 'CITS' AT GAME

BOSTON — Announcement by Bill Carrigan, manager of the Boston Red Sox, that he will wear a uniform during the approaching season leaves only one manager, Connie Mack, in the American league, out of character.

Two national league pilots will not dress the part, Wilbert Robinson and John J. McGraw. Despite their uniforms, however, five American league managers will do no playing. They are Miller Huggins, Yankees; Jack McCallister, Indians; Dan Hooley, Hoosiers; George Moriarty, Tigers; Bill Carrigan, Red Sox; Ruckey Harris and Ray Schalk will lead Washington and Chicago in person on the playing field. The National league outnumber the American in playing managers as O'Parrell of the Cardinals, Baneroff of the Braves and Melinnis of the Phillies will perform.

SOUTH AFRICANS TO PLAY AT WIMBLEDON

CAPETOWN, South Africa—A team of South African women tennis players is to compete for the Wimbledon championships at London for the first time in history. South Africa will also try for the Davis Cup, the probable team being: L. Raymond, an ex-Olympic games champion; C. E. Eaglestone of Natal; J. Condon of Transvaal, likely to prove one of the hardest drivers in Europe, and P. D. R. Spence, at present residing in England.

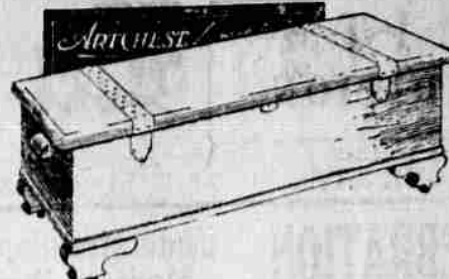
