### Klamath Falls Booze Traffic Worst, Is Claim

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Apr. 15.—Although careful not to prick the civic pride of Klamath Falls, W. K. Newell, Portland, federal prohibition administrator for Oregon, tacitly admitted that this city was "possibly one of the worst in the state from the standpoint of liquor violations."

Accompanied by R. C. Lyle, Seattle, federal prohibition administrator for the 25th district—which includes Oregon, Washington and Alaska—Mr. Newell arrived in Klamath Falls on a brief inspection trip.

"We do not wish to disclose our plans," Mr. Newell said. "That would be tipping off our hand. But this visit is made to acquaint Mr. Lyle with the situation here so that he may be conversant with the facts. We have certain plans of enforcement which will be put into effect in this territory."

**Solve Problem**  
"Klamath's biggest problem in liquor enforcement has been partially solved by the passage of a law by the California legislature making operation of a still a felony and making it mandatory that a person convicted be sentenced to at least one year in the penitentiary and fined \$1,000. Prior to this time, still operators have been let off easy in California and it has been from California sources that Klamath has secured its liquor."
