MENUS

By Sister Mary BREAKFAST—Cereal cooked with dates, cream, scrambled eggs with spinach...

LUNCHEON—Casseroles of turnips, cinnamon rolls, banana and orange salad, drop cakes, milk tea.

DINNER—Roast chicken, giblet gravy, savory rice, French fried onions, curly endive with bacon dressing, cream rolls, pineapple puff, milk, coffee.

The casserole of turnips suggested in the luncheon menu is quite unusual and decidedly "tasty". The woman on a farm will practically welcome the recipe since it uses in a novel manner one of the vegetables she has served frequently all winter...

Casseroles of Turnips Two cups turnips cut in small pieces, 2 tablespoons flour, 2 tablespoons butter, 2 cups stock or water, 1 egg, 4 tablespoons chopped mushroom, 1 tablespoon minced parsley, 1 teaspoon onion juice, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon pepper.

The turnips should be cut in pieces about the size of a baby lima bean. Cook in boiling water for twenty minutes. Drain and put into a well buttered casserole. Melt butter, stir in flour and when bubbling slowly, add stock, stirring constantly. Bring to the boiling point and remove from the fire. Add egg and stir rapidly until thoroughly mixed with sauce. Add mushrooms, parsley, onion juice, salt and pepper. Stir well and pour over turnips in casserole. Cover and place in a hot oven for fifteen minutes.

Serve from casseroles.
