USEFUL TIPS ON SEED SOWING

Do not fertilize the seed bed. It is not necessary and not advisable. Merely see that the soil is well pulverized and worked into good condition.

It is a real disadvantage to sow cabbage, cauliflower, brussels sprouts or any member of the so-called brassica which are to be transplanted in rich soil. They make much better, sturdier, stockier plants for transplanting on poor soil, but should be given the richest soil available when transplanted. Grown as seedlings in rich soil, they make a soft, sappy growth that makes their recovery on transplanting slow.

Give the rich soil in the permanent quarters, not in the seedbed. Use more seed, sow more thickly in heavy, cold soil than in light, warm soil.

A pound of peas will sow a row 60 feet long. Sowing beans will run 70 feet to the pound.

One ounce of onion seed planted as thinly as it should be will sow 100 feet.

Sow parsnip seed deeply, an inch and a half, unless the soil is very heavy. Then make it an inch.

May sowings will give better germination than April because there is less percentage rotted by cold and wet.

Never sow on wet soil. Select the driest portions of the garden for the earliest sowing.

A sprinkling of fine sand over a seedbed is useful in preventing the surface from caking before the seeds germinate. This is an excellent practice in heavy soils.

One foot apart is the minimum distance for the smaller growing vegetable rows, as it is the least distance in which a gardener can walk to manipulate a hoe. Heavy rootling vegetables should be placed 18 inches apart as a minimum.

You will get your onions from seed more quickly if they aren't sown so they have to fight for root room.
