### Farm Pointers

The bacterial leaf and cork disease on gladiolus in Oregon is controlled by using a formalin solution, says M. H. McKay, plant pathologist of the experiment station. One part of formalin to 30 parts of water is used and the cornus are soaked in this solution for 30 minutes a few days before planting. The disease can be recognized by rust-like spots on the leaves and rotting of the cornus.

Apple and pear wash are best controlled by being sure that leaves as well as fruit are thoroughly covered with spray, says H. P. Barks, Oregon experiment station pathologist.

Dahlias are propagated by cuttings as well as by tuber separation. One eye to each piece is essential in tuber cuttings. Stem cuttings—

about six inches long—are taken from vigorous terminal stems and preferably with a heel from the tuber attached. Stem cuttings have rooted readily at the Oregon state college greenhouse. For home use the cuttings are propagated in a sand bed protected by a cold frame.

The double plate germinator is a simple and convenient seed tester for small scale work. It consists of two soup plates, two blotters and a cup of sand. A blotter is laid over a plate of moistened sand and the counted seeds are propagated in a sand bed protected by a cold frame.

Size of seeds has a direct influence on size of plants, the size of the seedlings being generally proportionate to that of the seed. A distinct advantage is usually gained in using large and heavy seed, as shown in experiments at Oregon experiment station.
