## Boise Man Dead; Shoots Wife And Then Kills Self

BOISE, Ida., Apr. 30.—Wallace Maddox, 28, is dead and his wife, Pearl Shaver Maddox, 19, lies critically injured in St. Alphonsus hospital, as a result of a quarrel at the home of the latter's grandparents, Mrs. and Mrs. Fred Murray, 1400 Colorado avenue, about 7 o'clock Friday evening. Maddox, after shooting his wife and firing twice at her step-father, G. T. Smith, turned the gun on himself, dying instantly.

No motive could be found for the murder-suicide other than incompatibility, which reached a climax when Mrs. Maddox refused to return with her husband to the John Archibald sheep camp, seven miles southwest of Boise, where Maddox was employed. Relatives say the young couple had been married about a year and "did not get along." At no time in the past, however, had Maddox threatened his wife. Maddox was in poor health, and was of nervous temperament, which, relatives believe accounts for his impulse to kill himself and his wife.

The tendency is common among women in particular to disregard even such warning symptoms as are present.

It cannot be too strongly emphasized that irregularities of menstruation are no more normal at forty-five than at twenty-five, and they are usually much more serious than unnatural discharges should never be tolerated without an investigation into their cause; and that any variation from the normal in the type, amount, duration, and frequency demands a prompt and thorough investigation.

Finally, every woman owes to herself adequate medical attention. If she consults a physician for uterine bleeding and is dismissed with medicine, without a thorough examination, she should seek another physician at once. No amount of trouble should be considered too great to establish the diagnosis, one way or the other. Cancer in itself is not necessarily fatal, but delay in its recognition and treatment invariably is.

**PERIODIC EXAMINATIONS OF WOMEN WILL CUT CANCER DEATHS**

Since one woman out of every five between the ages of 45 and 65 dies of cancer, and since cancer of the cervix (or neck of the womb) is responsible for more than half of these deaths, it is evident that periodic examinations of the pelvic organs is quite as important in women as periodic examination of the heart, lungs, and kidneys.

Injuries of the birth canal in women who have borne children supply the sort of soil in which cancer grows most readily, and examinations at regular intervals will detect these injuries and the infections which so frequently accompany them, while their prompt treatment will eliminate the irritation which is an important predisposing cause of the disease.

Every case of cancer is originally a purely local condition, and it can be recognized at this stage, its surgical removal will result in a cure in possibly three-quarters of the cases. As a rule, however, the proportion of cases of cancer of the cervix which are seen in the early stage does not total 20 per cent at most, and probably 10 per cent is more accurate.

In most instances the disease is so far advanced that radical surgery is out of the question, and in a tragic number only palliative measures are possible. Regular examinations, which will result in the detection of early cases of cancer, will change this state of affairs, and will make the proportion of permanent cures many times higher than it is at present.

Unfortunately, in cancer of the internal organs, the symptoms are seldom pronounced until the disease is rather far advanced, and
