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STERILIZATION OF INSANE IS LEGAL

WASHINGTON, May 2 (AP).—State laws providing for the sterilization of feeble-minded persons were sustained today by the supreme court.

The Virginia law was attacked by Carrie Buck, an inmate of the state colony for epileptics and feeble-minded. The state insisted that its constitution in the public welfare would also come to the advantage of the public and would permit her release.

Fifteen other states have similar laws.

Kellogg Speaks At Pan-American Meet

WASHINGTON, May 2 (AP).—The United States desires nothing from Latin-America that she is not willing to reciprocate in kind.

Secretary Kellogg will in an address today opening the third Pan-American commercial conference.

Four hundred delegates from the United States and the 20 Latin-American republics, including the secretary of Kellogg, will be in attendance.

They will discuss the "unity of purpose and unity of action" of the American nations.
