## OREGON BERRIES RIPENING LATE

State Wholly Dependent Upon California Output at Present

PORTLAND, Ore., May 6 (AP).—Oregon strawberries are very backward as compared with last year. Whereas harvesting of early varieties was in full swing at this time last year, plantations are three weeks behind in their development now, due to continued cool weather. The local market is still wholly dependent on California supplies. Arrivals are in from many points in Central California, but much of the stuff is quite green.

Fifteen plant crates as selling at from \$2.25 to \$3.25, with occasional fancy offerings taking \$3.50.

Butter and egg prices are steady and unchanged today. Storage of butter is growing rapidly, with 11,100 pounds in coolers at close of business yesterday. Additions to local egg storage amounted to 1122 cases yesterday.

Increased country meats and poultry are about steady.

Whole milk declined 5 cents this afternoon. The new price is \$2.25 per quart. E. O. B. Portland.

**Lumber Outlook Held Encouraging**  
NEW YORK, May 6 (AP).—The "lumber thermometer" of business is encouraging, says the National Lumber Manufacturers Association's review for the week ending April 29. While 14 fewer softwood mills reported, marked increases in production, although high water closed some mills, and new business were noted, with shipments about the same as the week before. Decreases in all three items were shown compared with a year ago. Hardwood production fell off in the week, shipments were larger and new business, halted.
