It was 5:30 a. m. The scene is in the death house with a condemned man who is to be hanged at the stroke of six. A young district attorney is pleading with him, urging him to tell the full story of the murder of which he was convicted. It is apparent he is withholding important evidence which might save him. But even as the hour for his death grows nearer and nearer the doomed man's lips remained sealed—he maintains his strange silence.

Such is the dramatic opening situation of "Silence," Beulah Marie Dix's thrilling screen version of Max Merz's famed crook melodrama, which was filmed under Rupert Julian's direction, and which will be shown at the Sherry theater for two days beginning Sunday.
