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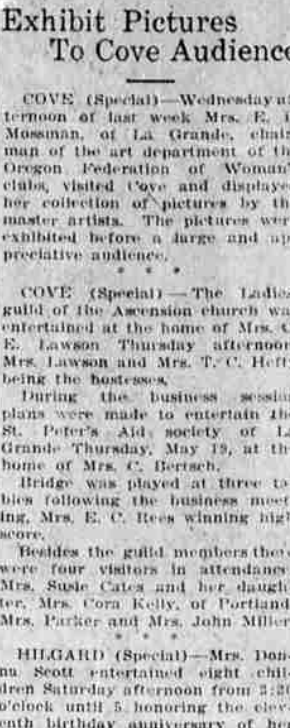
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During the business session plans were made to entertain the St. Peter's Aid society of La Grande Thursday, May 13, at the home of Mrs. C. Hetty.

Keep delphinium or perennial larkspur seeds between moist blotters for three days before planting. These seeds are of uncertain germination except when planted just after ripening. The moisture gives a much higher percentage of germination than if planted dry.

Watch for current worms and white butterflies and spray the small cabbage and cauliflower plants before the worms get a chance.

Plant poppy seeds in a pinch at a time a foot apart each way and then pull up all but the strongest plants. You will have real poppies with a minimum of work by this method.

Take a chance on an early bean crop. They may elude any cold nights that often nip them early in the season and they are that much dear gain.

Try a row of French endive to store in the cellar next fall for winter salads. It is a big money saver and the finest of salad materials. It is as easy to raise as parsnips.

Watch plants in the frames that they don't get too crowded and spindling. Thin or take a chance and transplant a few even if they are tender. There is always a good gambling chance in the garden.

Row portulaca or rose moss and wait for a few hot days to revive it. This seed will not germinate until the heat suits it, no matter when it is planted.

Put in Iceland radishes to follow the little fellows.

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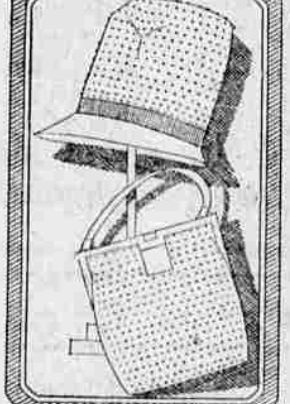
