Pendleton Heads Worry Over Keg Mystery Field

PENDLETON, May 11. (AP)—What mystery is cloaked behind the unearthing of five empty, 55-gallon kegs and two additional kegs of bonded whiskey on a farm near the railroad tracks west of here yesterday by the sheriff's force is puzzling local officers today.

Sheriff R. T. Cookingham was called to the farm by the owner who reported that Tuesday night men had wandered about his pasture, dug holes and had in one place dug a hole of considerable depth and left empty 55-gallon kegs beside the spot. The kegs, however, had been empty for a number of years. Search by the sheriff and his deputies led to the finding of additional empty kegs

and two full ones. The spot where the kegs were found is overgrown with brush and other growth, indicating that the barrels have been in the ground for over ten years and the men who were seeking the cache were unfamiliar with the spot for a number of prospect holes had been dug before they located the empty barrels.

The remains of the official government seal was found on the head of all the kegs.

ROBBERY HELD AS MOTIVE FOR DEATH OF MAN

SPOKANE, Wash., May 11 (AP)—Belief that P. C. Sears, aged 39, whose body was found near here Sunday, was beaten and robbed and left for dead, was expressed by his daughter, Miss L. A. Zumbach, of Aberdeen, Wash., who arrived here today.

She said he left Aberdeen April 20, with his ticket and \$50. No money was found on his body and his shoes and stockings were missing. Mrs. Zumbach believes he confided in a stranger, who took him to the secluded spot, beat him and searched his body for money.

His feet were bruised and scratched, and she thinks he may have recovered consciousness and wandered about afterwards. The coroner found death was due to exposure and pneumonia.

He is survived by nine other children, residents of Ontario, Bend and McCoy, Ore., and Seattle.
