Getting the experts who consigned them to the second division at the start of the season, the Chicago White Sox not only had a tighter hold on second place in the American league today but actually were threatening the lead of the pace-setting yanks.
The three-hit victory pitched by the White Sox hurling ace, Alphonso Thomas, against the St.

Louis Browns yesterday went down in the records as one of the finest pitching exhibitions seen in either league this year and gave the critics one good reason why the Sox are up where they are.

At the same time the Yankees were losing to the Senators, 2 to 2, enabling the Chicago club to cut down the New Yorker's long lead to less than 100 percentage points.

A double-header between Cleveland and Detroit gave those two members of the second division an even break, the Indians taking the first, 9 to 4, and the Tigers the second, 7 to 5.

In the National league the Pittsburgh Pirates tightened their hold on first place by walloping Cincinnati for an 8 to 5 victory, while the Phils renewed their effort to climb out of the second division by beating the Brooklyn Robins, 7 to 1.

'LINDY' TO FLY FOR PARISIANS

American Aviator, Conqueror of Atlantic, Remains France's Idol

PARIS, May 24 (AP)—Captain Charles A. Lindbergh is firmly established as an idol in France. Today, the third since he completed his memorable air journey, the enthusiasm of Parisians showed no signs of waning, and his natural simplicity was making fresh friends every hour.

The universal spontaneous attention paid for him among all classes and conditions of Frenchmen is absolutely unique. No honor, if it is felt, can be adequate to express the national admiration. His every action is talked of eagerly by the impressionable Gallic people; he is sung of by popular bands; "Lindbergh, the sign" is on every lip. Primitive bands consisting of violin, guitar and concertina, popular songs, written in his honor in every market place and square, the town warbling the verses through megaphones.

Plans Reception
But the people are not satisfied with talking and reading about the hero; they want to see him, and they have had little opportunity thus far in his rapid trips from the American embassy escorted just this afternoon by secret service men. It was with the idea of satisfying the popular desire that the city council fixed, on Thursday, which is American day and a public holiday for a reception, so that as many as possible can get a glimpse of him.

That day the president of the city council, the vice-presidents and officers of the assembly will go in state to the embassy to accompany Lindbergh in an open carriage by the Arc de Triomphe through the Champs Elysees and the Rue Rivoli to the city hall, on the steps of which he will be presented to Parisians. Later he will sign the "golden book" as did Louis Blériot after his flight across the English channel 20 years ago.

Will See Him Fly
Lindbergh knows that the people, above all, want to see him in action in his element, and he is going to try to give them an exhibition of the skill which brought

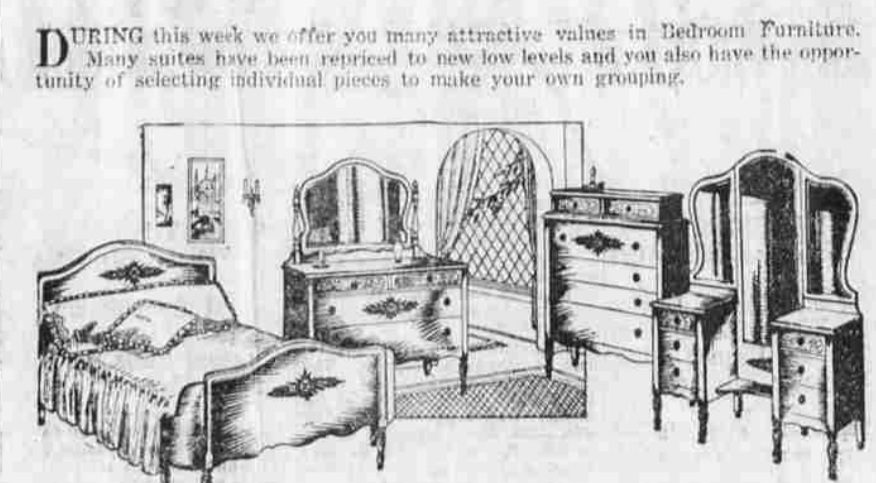
