WEAK PRICES ON OREGON BERRIES

Better Weather Brings Larger Supply—Butter and Eggs Unchanged

PORTLAND, Ore., June 1 (AP)—Oregon strawberries are the cheapest of the season on the local market. Better growing weather has brought on a larger crop. Prices for Gold Dollars have been forced down to \$3.50 per crate, whereas improved Oregon berries from \$4.00 to \$4.50. Dirt is noticeable in most of the berries, due to recent rains.

Receipts of strawberries from California are expected in much larger amounts for the remainder of the season, which is far advanced in the south. The demand for the Oregon berries is strong from northern markets.

Butter and egg prices are unchanged on the local dairy exchange. Storage continues at a fair pace, with 12,255 pounds of butter and 425 cases of eggs put away yesterday.

Poultry and dressed poultry meat prices continue about steady with receipts lighter the last two days in most lines.

Bullish Trend Gains Strength In Wall Street

NEW YORK, June 1 (AP)—Bullish enthusiasm ran rampant again in today's stock market, with more than 30 issues again moving to new high ground. Bear traders succeeded in uncovering a few weak spots, but offerings generally were well absorbed.

Auto stocks were again bought in large volume, with speculative interest centering in the hard coal carrying and western merger issues. Texas and Pacific was the individual feature, soaring 7 1/2 points to a new high of 95. Jersey Central jumped 9 points to 12 on a relatively small volume. L-high Valley, Reading, Great Northern preferred, Colorado Southern and Pure Marquette also reached new high ground.

Sharp gains were recorded by a number of specialties, particularly Laclede Gas, General Refractories and Phillips preferred and Savings Bonds up 1 to nearly 10 points. On the other hand, Burns Brothers "A" Foundation company and Real Milk Hosiery, broke 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 points to new low ground for the year.

The closing was strong. Jones Central increased its rise to 15 points, Laclede Gas to 15 and General Refractories to 5 in the course of the late afternoon which carried a great many additional shares into new high territory. 804 Southwestern rose over 4 points and New York Central, Reading, Baldwin, National Dairy Products and Safety Sable moved up fast. Foundation company, however, dropped 5 points. Total sales approximated 7,200,000 shares.
