ADVOCATES MORE TAX REDUCTION

Senator Edge Urges Coolidge to Lop Off More Than \$300,000,000

WASHINGTON, June 2 (AP)—Tax reduction of even more than \$300,000,000 was advocated today by Senator Edge, of New Jersey, a republican member of the senate finance committee, at a conference with President Coolidge.

Senator Edge would raise the \$200,000,000 limit suggested by other republicans, and would consume all of the prospective surplus in the reduction program, contrary to the policy of the treasury in saving a margin with which to work on.

"I believe large surpluses," the New Jersey senator said, "are inviting of congressional experimentation."

He proposed that the 12 1/2 per cent corporation tax be cut at least one per cent more. He believed the national surplus of 20 per cent should be reduced and businesses taxes repealed, but he favored retention of the levy on auto pleasure cars.

Seige Of Prison Ends; Tampa Is Again Peaceful

TAMPA, Fla., June 2 (AP)—Tampa was quiet this morning. Apparently the siege of the Hillsborough county jail was at an end.

After three nights of rioting, which took a toll of five killed and more than a score wounded as mobs of infuriated civilians sought to enter the jail to take a confessed murderer, 1900 special deputies entered a nine-block square throughout the city last night and there was peace.

Thirty alleged members of the mob were under arrest this morning awaiting action by a grand jury.

The special officers, sworn in at a mass meeting of citizens yesterday, organized a detachment of 500 national guardsmen, who rushed to the scene shortly after the trouble started Sunday night.

Throughout the rioting, the object of the mob's wrath, R. P. Lewis, who had confessed he killed Herman Merritt, his wife and three children, thinking they were another family who had done him a "dirty trick," was safe from their fury, imprisoned in another county, officers announced.

Arrest of J. R. "Slim" Hudson, 45, a sign painter, implicated by Lewis in the slaying, was announced yesterday it is said.

Taking Fish Eggs At Diamond Lake

PORTLAND, Ore., June 2 (AP)—Fish egg taking has at last started at Diamond Lake and is proceeding at a rapid rate, according to the May report of M. L. Tyckman, state superintendent of fisheries. About 2,000,000 have been taken and 2,000,000 more are in sight. One trap at the lake captured 600 female trout during a single night.

Elect Luper As State Engineer

SALEM, Ore., June 2 (AP)—Luper was elected by the state legislative commission to day to succeed himself as state engineer, and his salary was increased from \$3,000 to \$3,200 a year. The election was contentious, but Governor Patterson voted against the salary increase. The other members of the commission are Secretary of State Kupper and State Treasurer Kay.

A young woman drew from a public library a book about English cathedrals. She was amused to discover from the data on the charging slip that the book had been in the library 14 years, had been taken out only seven times, and the pages in the second half of the book were still uncut. She saw in these facts an unflattering commentary on the culture of her fellow-citizens. But the tale is incomplete until one learns whether the book was well written and interesting, or whether it was the kind that would mean something only to trained architects. One also would like to know whether the amused one finished the book herself and cut the pages in that second half.

GIRLS AND BOYS

Women, psychologists say, with all her apparent whims and vagaries, is the "regular" half of the human race, and man is the "irregular" half. This judgment seems confirmed by extensive tests of boys and girls made in a large public school system.

The boys, says the chief examiner, present more mental peculiarities than the girls. The latter have less individuality than the boys, and tend more to fall within an average grouping. They are likely to be neither very good nor very bad, neither very bright nor very dull, with few eccentricities or strong mental points. The boys are stronger individualists, conforming less to standardized treatment, more inclined to disturb class routine, and to be markedly stupid or markedly bright.

The examiners conclude that boys are more of a school problem than girls, requiring more careful, individual attention. Also that it is among boys rather than girls that signs of genius are to be looked for. "I think it may be questioned whether we have yet found the right kind of education for boys," concludes the examiner. "In the future, I believe, teachers will find it more important to be grounded in psychology than in pedagogy."

A case in point that comes readily to mind is that of Charles Lindbergh. That young man, who seems to be a veritable genius, got low grades in high school and college, and left before finishing his course, to take up practical aviation work. He worked hard and brilliantly on scientific and mechanical subjects, but worked to satisfy himself rather than his teachers, and would not bother with the little, formal requirements insisted on for getting good grade marks. The educational system wasn't adapted to handling that kind of boy.
