

LABOR BILL MAY CAUSE STRUGGLE

Tory Die-Hards Trying to Make England Commit Business Suicide

LONDON, June 3.—With America "sitting pretty" at the top of the business of the world, and with Germany steadily working to come back to a place in the industrial sun, the British Tory Die-Hards are trying to make England commit business suicide.

The bill regarding the trade unions, which they are about to pass through parliament, is a measure which should be properly labeled.

"A bill to encourage the bitterness of political strife, to perpetuate a class war, to arrest the nation's progress towards industrial recovery, and to bring about in the workers a mind in which they will not at their own risk to continue in the production of American and German goods."

Henry Ford's First Appearance



This picture of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Ford, taken at a campaign dinner opening a drive to raise \$100,000 for welfare buildings, marks the first public appearance of the motor manufacturer since the accident to Mr. Ford on March 27. It also was his first appearance in connection with any campaign for four years. The Fords gave \$100,000 toward the buildings. Between the Fords is seated Charles Beecher Warren, former U. S. ambassador to Japan.

Hardy have had their innings. The Tory party convention at Southampton, over-whelmingly passed a resolution demanding death sentences. The bill recently introduced in the Commons by Sir Douglas Hoag, the attorney general, goes even beyond the wildest dreams of the Die-Hards.

It declares, illegal any strike, if it has any object in addition to the furtherance of a trade dispute within the trade con-

cerned, or if it is calculated to coerce the government or intimidate the community or any substantial part of it. Penalties provided are anywhere from 1,000 fine to two years imprisonment. Any workman refusing to take part in such a strike is protected by this law from being expelled from his union, or, in fact, dismissed.

Second-Marketing is forbidden, if it is calculated to intimidate

reasonable apprehension of injury to himself, his family or his property.

Bar Union Levies

Third—At present most trades unions levy on each member a sum which is devoted to the political campaign of the labor party. If a member does not want to contribute, he signs a paper as disavowing and is then immune. Under the proposed law, no member is subject to a political levy unless he signs a paper specifically disavowing himself in favor of it.

War was declared the moment the bill was introduced. Its first effect was to shake up the ranks of the labor party, which had suffered a serious breach between its right and left wings. The Aquilids and the Lloyd George wings of the Liberal party have also been brought together by the bill.

"A charter of freedom for the workman," is the slogan of the Tories.

A charter for "backings" is the slogan of the Labor party leaders.

Leaders Are Bitter

Mr. Premier Ramsay MacDonald, before his recent trip to America, called the bill "a measure to force labor into political, economic and social subordination."

Mr. Chamberlain of the Conservative Party, one of the most conservative of the Labor leaders, said: "Nobody but one of the kind of a man who could have conceived such a bill. At a time when the nation's greatest need is better relations in industry, the government has thrown into the industrial arena a bomb of contention which is going to make our industrial world a shambles for years to come."

Mr. Herbert Samuel, the new chief of the head of the political machinery of the Liberal party, said:

"The government pays too much attention to the petty squabbles in London, which are a few of those labor agitators against the wall and have them sent. That is not a method to solve the problems of our complex industrial society. There is nothing so dangerous in politics as a combination of the two hands and the labor hand."

Predicts Class War

But the bitterest saying was that of John Wheatley, health minister in the Labor government:

"They have decided war is in favor of their class. That's all right. We will know what to do when our class comes on top at the elections and we control the government."

Already the political breakdown of all the parties are beginning with intense activity. The Tories, with their immediate interest in the bill, the Labor leaders intent on being home in the country that the bill sweeps away all labor legislation passed for a hundred years.

They say the class about political parties is a completely attempt to suppress the labor party in favor of its opponents, whereas the Tories can get all the money they want from their wealthy men. This will lead to a more drastic in parliament in which the rule of the majority will undoubtedly be used.

The Liberals are happy. They have won the bill as a Tory measure which will reduce the Liberal party and support MacDonald and of every other Tory coalition in the bill.

In the meantime, hundreds of all classes are getting out for a parliamentary session and for a summer recess which will be the reference and the most important. This country has seen for 100 years.

English King Is 62 Years of Age; Attends "Oaks"

LONDON, June 3 (AP)—George V, King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, is 62 years old today. He celebrated the occasion by attending the "Oaks" with Queen Mary. The "Oaks" is "sacred day" at the Derby.

Tomorrow the historic ceremony of "trooping the colors" at the Horse Guards parade, Whitehall, will honor the king's birthday. King George, mounted on a charger and wearing the huge bearskin hat of the Foot Guards, will take the salute of his household troops before an admiring audience of thousands of Britons and many overseas visitors.

This year finds His Majesty the ruler of more than 488,000,000 people inhabiting an area of 11,215,742 square miles.

Thousands of telegrams and telegrams of congratulations from all parts of the world, and from nearly every important ruler, were received at Buckingham Palace this morning.

Alarmed in their picturesque uniforms, the troops attached to the royal household, which include the Foot Guards, the Welch Guards, the Scots Guards, the Life Guards, and the Horse Guards, will be inspected by His Majesty King George, accompanied by

numerous dignitaries, will take the salute of each battalion as it marches past with bands playing and banners flying. The royal troops will halt and the command, "Three cheers for his Majesty King George the Fifth," will be given. A hearty compliance will terminate the ceremony.

The full dress uniforms of the various guards regiments are of unflattering interest to American visitors. The Foot Guards are seen in the proximity of Buckingham Palace. They are easily distinguished by their huge bearskin headgear.

The Life and Horse Guards are seen at the Horse Guards Parade, where two mounted sentries always are the centre of an admiring crowd of onlookers.

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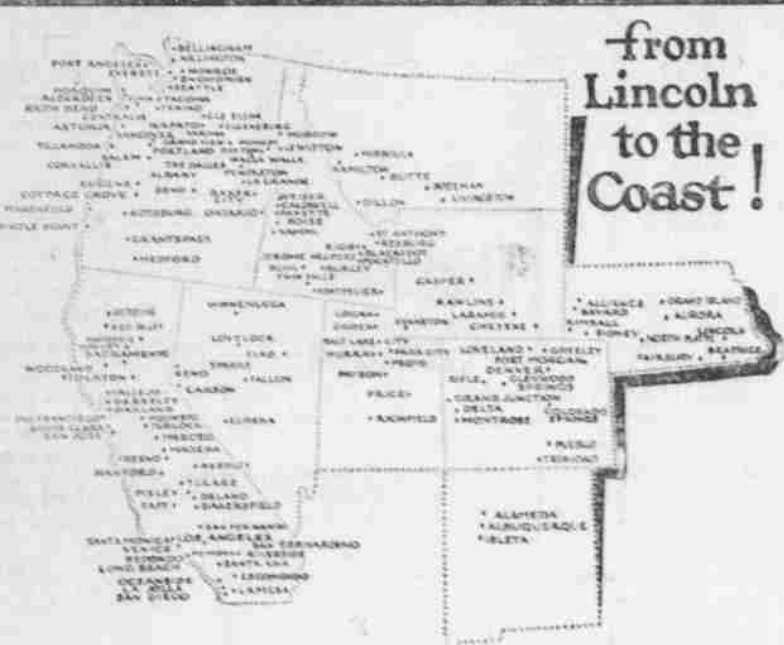

FACTS about used car allowances

Most new car sales now involve the trading-in of a buyer's used car. More and more people are asking: "Why should my used car seem to have several values? Why should dealers in different makes of cars offer me allowances differing materially? Does the largest allowance offered mean the best deal for me?"

Here are basic facts:

- 1 Your used car has seemingly different values because competitive dealers are bidding to sell you a new car.
- 2 Your used car has only one fundamental basis of value: what the dealer who accepts it in trade can get for it in the used car market.
- 3 The largest trade-in allowance which is offered on your used car is not necessarily the best deal for you. Sometimes it is; but sometimes it is not.
- 4 An excessive allowance may mean that you are paying an excessive price for the new car in comparison with its real value.
- 5 Judge the merits of the new car in comparison with its price, including all delivery and finance charges. Then weigh any difference in allowance offered on your used car.

WHEN YOU are ready to trade-in your present car, remember that after all you are making a purchase and not a sale. You are buying a new car and simply applying your present car as a credit toward the purchase price of a new car.

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
