ASTORIA, Ore., June 3.—With May fishing concluded, a survey of the first four weeks of the fishing season shows the yield to be somewhat subnormal.

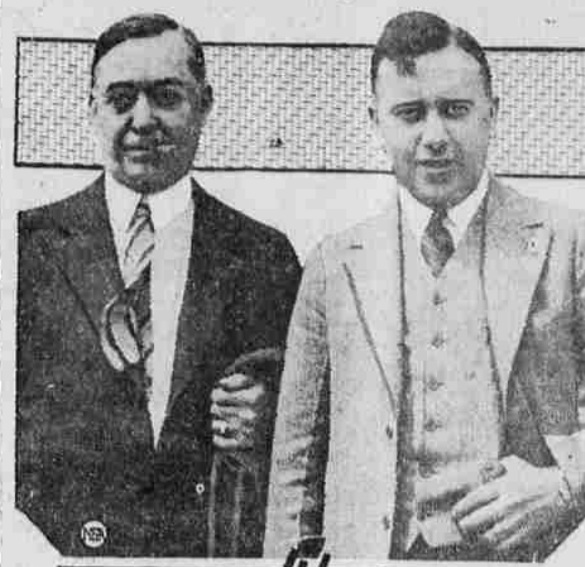
The exceptionally good returns of the first week of the season have been offset by three succeeding weeks when the fishing was distressingly poor...
