WALPOLE TO WRITE LAKE COUNTRY NOVEL

LONDON—Hugh Walpole intends to write a novel of the Lake country of England, which heretofore has been the inspiration almost solely of poets.

The idea came to him, Walpole said during a visit to America, while he was at his country home in that part of northern England where Wadsworth, De Quincey, Southey and Coleridge lived.

Walpole is now at his Cumberland home finishing work on two forthcoming novels, "Winter's Moon" and "Jerusalem," in which his boy character "Jeremy" reaches school age.

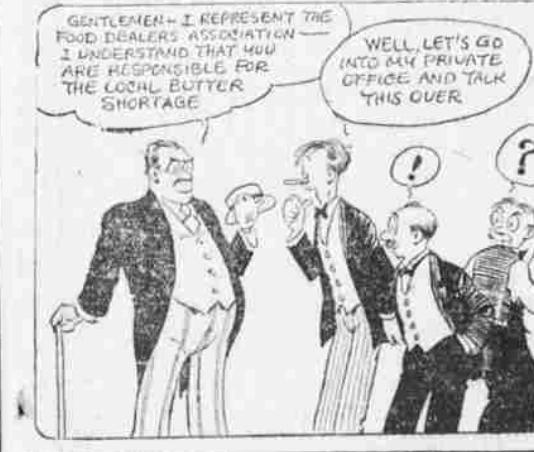

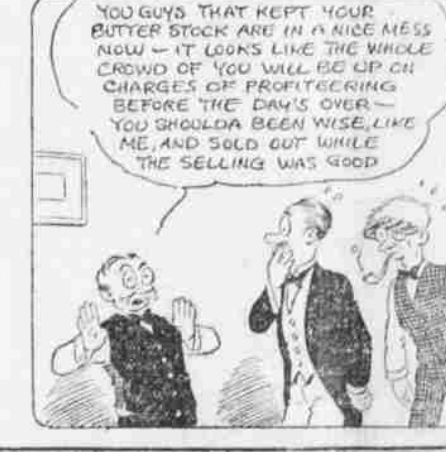
