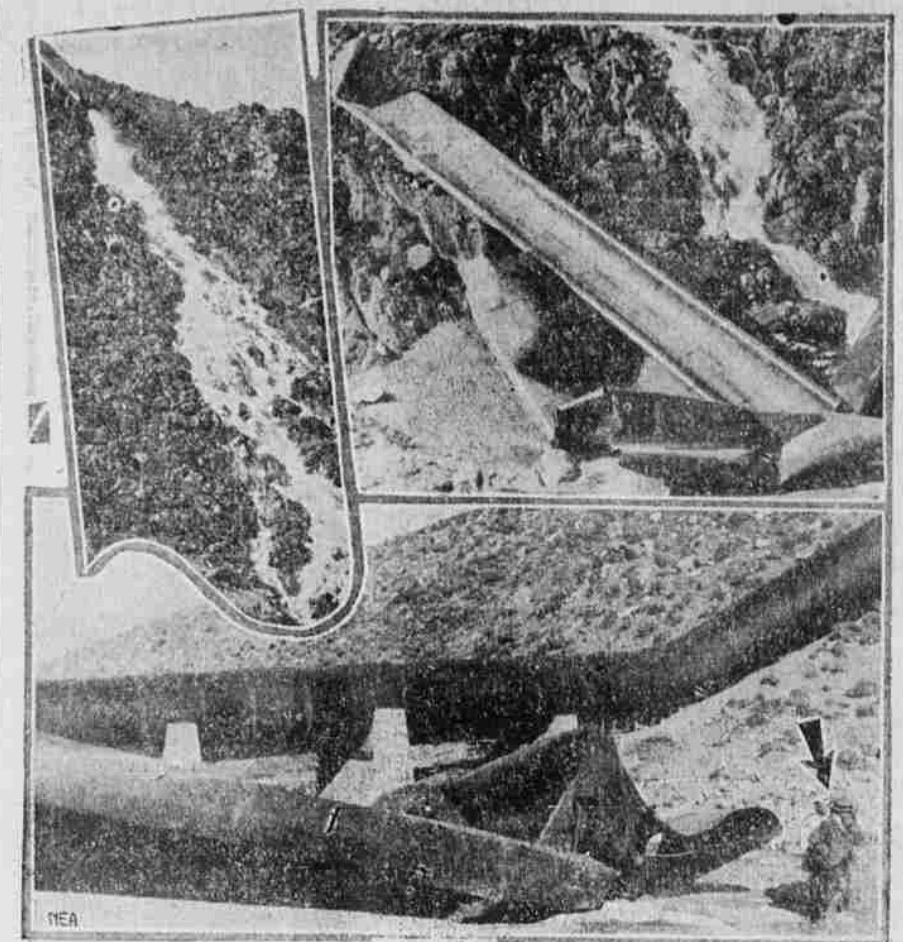

Poom on the leaves of strawberry plants is caused annually by the "spittle bug" which may be controlled by applications of any fine dust—powdered air-sifted lime, sulfur, wood ashes or even road dust generously applied.
