### Soldiers' Trail Still Easy To Find In France

CHATEAULIBERTY, France (AP)—American army relics and souvenirs are still visible throughout the former battle zone in France.

Some recall grimly death and devastation of war; others have a lighter touch showing that the doughboy's sense of humor never abandoned him even when shells were flying about. A few have been all too indifferent.

The route of the glass flows by Quentin Roosevelt on that 114th day, July 14, 1918, when the son of the former president of the United States was killed in aerial combat and crashed at Chateau Liberty.

When the American soldier, who modestly signed his diary of an Indian's head with his initials "L. G. G.," Santa Monica, Cal., finished his work in July, 1918, he realized that he was creating a masterpiece for the education of natives for miles around Mission Hills.

The owner of the ruins expects to rebuild his property this year but he says he will keep the stones upon which the Indian's head is "intended" and have them placed well in evidence in the front wall of the new building.

"Not to keep out—your 'Gee's Mess' is the sign which, defying the rains and storms of the past ten years, will greet the former officers and men of the 42nd Division when returning as members of the American Legion next September; they visit the Convent of Saint Francis. The sign was painted there by units of that division during the 1918 drive.

Driving through the Santa Michel sector, the correspondent noticed a hiker's delivery automobile, which had a familiar appearance. It was one of the old ambulances of the American army. Now it is dispensing bread—the "staff of life"—to the French in the same sector.

### Christianity Spreads In Soviet Russia Despite State Atheists

MOSCOW, June 10 (AP)—Christianity is spreading in Soviet Russia despite the intense activity of the State Anti-Religion Organization, an unofficial communist body with branches throughout the Soviet Union.

The growth is most pronounced, according to government figures, in the Baptist and Evangelical denominations.

M. Poutintsev, a member of the Anti-Religion body, attributes the growth of Christianity to the fact that young men enroll as Christians to escape military service.

Under the old regime the religious aversion to war manifested by members of these churches was respected by the imperial government and the same immunity has been continued under the present regime.

In their organization the "sectarians" copy the methods of the Communists. They have propaganda bureaus, and only accept applicants as candidates, prior to admission to full membership. In Ekranin whose villages adopt new religions, it is estimated that the number of "militant sectarians," or active religious propagandists, amounts to 1,500,000 men.

Poutintsev estimates that there are in Russia today 5,000,000 Orthodox, the rest which split off from the Russian Orthodox church in the seventeenth century. He places the total of members of other sects at 6,000,000. His data on the Baptists and Evangelists brings him only up to 1923 when he says there were 51,000 in Kiev and Minsk provinces alone. These figures he believes to have been greatly augmented since then.

### Contracts Let For New Hotel

PULLMAN, Wash., June 10—Within the next two weeks work on Pullman's new \$155,000 hotel will be under way, the trustees of the Pullman Community Hotel corporation at a meeting last night having authorized the officers to execute contracts for the construction work with those holders of a work order who will accept the contracts at reduced figures made possible by slight changes in the plans and specifications.

The contract for general construction of the new 60-room hotel will be awarded to Heiges & Huis of Portland at \$71,442. The original bid submitted by Heiges & Huis was \$82,880. Mr. Huis, representing the company, is in Pullman and has expressed his willingness to sign a contract at the reduced estimates. The papers will be signed soon and work will start as soon as the materials can be secured.

The company agrees to complete the structure within five months from the date that excavation work is started.

area surrounding it, belongs to Pickens and Wiley. The new El Dorado does not bid to outsiders.

The discovery of the fabulous gold strike from which Pickens and Wiley already have received more than \$100,000—250 pounds of ore having them \$16,032 at the Omaha smelter—was accidental. In 1902, while crossing a wash near the little Annie mine, where he was employed, Pickens found a piece of ore about half the size of a man's head. A few days later he found a small bottle, which he identified as the piece from whence the original find apparently had been carried by the elements. Exposure had caused moss to form over the vein and it was difficult to detect the vein from common rock.

Pickens kept the find to himself until last summer. Having obtained the required leases, he was accompanied by his son and another man, each armed with a pick and removal of the ore was started.

The bottle being inaccessible for nearly nine months to the group, Pickens and his two workers labored during the three summer months and made from the ore which they have sold, removed more than 25 tons which he stacked behind barricaded doors, awaiting the coming of the summer and the melting of the snows.

Summitville is in the San Juan mountains, long famous for yielding precious ores, and is approximately 40 miles southwest of Del Norte and about 250 miles southwest of Denver.
