

BATTLE FIELDS OF FRANCE NOW QUIET

Birds Sing and Oxen Labor Where Americans Fought and Died

RODSONE, France (AP)—Peace and quiet now prevail through most of the once war devastated area between Soissons and Chateau-Thierry, where the First and Second American Divisions fought and died, in July, 1918.

General Mangin's observatory at La Tour-Roumont, in the Forest of Villers Cotteret, from which he watched the American doughboys and his own French Army 29th Corps go into battle on that fateful morning, has withstood the inclemencies of the weather for nearly nine years.

The observatory, however, is much more thickly populated than when Mangin and members of his staff made it their headquarters.

Then the whistling of bullets and the shrieking of shells provided the music for the drama of war. Now sweet songbirds have made the observatory their home and fill the air with their notes. One of them has built its nest in an old empty shell.

In the cavern between Chaudun and Berry-au-Bac, were members of the First Division captured more than 400 German soldiers with their officers, small boys dig worms to go fishing.

Two white oxen are plowing in a field near Longpont. On that very spot on July 15, 1918, the Second American Division met with stubborn resistance and many were killed.

"Your boys will find a big change when they come in September," said Julien Damoy, a chauffeur. He referred to the visit of the American Legion.

"Everything has changed so," he added. "Look at this bus of mine. It is a veteran of the Marine, a motor of the 1914 vintage. It is still kicking, although it requires a lot of attention. But it also looks much better than it did in those days."

Iowa Farmers Grow Strong, New Oat

DES MOINES, Ia. (AP)—For the first time Iowa farmers will harvest this year a new selection of the Kherson oat under the name of "Iogold."

The specie was developed from a single plant selected by Prof. L. C. Burnett of Ames, Iowa, in 1906. It was brought to its present stage after twenty years of cooperative experiments by the Iowa Agricultural Experiment Station and the United States department of agriculture.

Outstanding characteristics of "Iogold" are high yielding power, stiffness of straw and resistance to stem rust. The average acre yield is 62.3 bushels as compared with 64.2 bushels for "Iowar."
