UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, June 27 (Special)—Notice of acceptance of his book, "An Outline of Physics" has been received by Dr. A. E. Caswell, professor of physics of the University of Oregon, from the Macmillan company. The work will be published as a textbook before fall. The book will be of 775 pages, and is intended, especially for use in college courses. It is radically different from any existing textbook in physics in that it begins with that part of the subject which is attractive to the student, leaving the more dry and technical phases to the science to later treatment.
