The Garden SUMMER SWEET CORN BEST

Ancient gardeners insist that the latest planted sweet corn is the sweetest and that May plantings never give as sugary ears as those planted in July and August.

Sweet corn growers say that the seed should not be put in the earth when it is wet but that the gardeners should wait until the soil is moist. With a fairly dry start in moist, but not wet soil, the rains will do the rest.

Planted during the warmer months, the gardener should be liberal in the use of fertilizers and the commercial fertilizers are best to handle later in the season and also readily available when stable manure is not.

It is now well understood that corn planted in squares gives fuller ears than when planted in long single or double rows as the space arrangement gives a more even and better distribution of the pollen or dust from the tassels which must come in contact with the silks to produce the kernels and fill out the cobs.

There need be no worry about the sweet corn crop even if it has not been possible to get the usual early start with it. There will be plenty of corn of fine quality from the later plantings. Of course everybody wants Golden Bantam but there are other good corns.
